

## **TESLIN ROADS**

We have had above average amounts of snow this year so there could be limited visibility at intersections, please drive with caution. We are working on removing snow but in the meantime please be careful. As Spring arrives our crew will be out steaming ditches.

## SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Monday, Tuesday Closed to public Wednesday–Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

The recycling center is open for refundables, though customers will have to sort and count their own recycling while the attendant observes.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

Northern Enviro Services from Watson lake plans a weekly trip to Teslin to provide septic pump-out services, please plan ahead and schedule your pump-out by contacting their office at 867-536-7361.



## WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

Please ensure your driveways are plowed so the water truck and driver can safely access your fill spout.

## **DOG CONTROL**

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.



## Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

## March 2021 Recreation Report

Our regular programs were sidelined a bit this month so we could focus on some bigger things and as a result March was awesommmmmme!!!!

While we weren't able to harvest a Bison for the community, our youth hunt at the beginning of the month was still a great success. Thanks to funding from Crime Prevention Victim Services Trust we were able to partner with TTC game guardians, local CO's and a couple of Elders to bring 4 youth out to Kloo Lake for a 5-day trip. Youth gained great experience in camp life by helping to set tents, haul wood and keep fires going, and tear down camp. The youth would have also been responsible for helping prepare meals if we weren't limited by COVID guidelines requiring us to only have 1 food handler. We spent 3 full days out exploring the area searching for the herd. We finally spotted a group of 10 bison late afternoon on our last hunting day, but they were unfortunately in an area we couldn't get to at the time.

Recreation has been acquiring a good inventory of gear for land-based programs so we can run more of these kinds of trips. We are excitedly looking towards getting more community members out on the land this summer and have the wheels in motion to embark on a fall hunt.

The 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Teslin Mini-Rendezvous was a tremendous success. We had lots of support running events and the participation throughout the 8 days was fantastic!! 108 Adults & 60 Kids were tracked on participation sheets over the course of the week. ## Message from the Mayor April 2, 2021

Well, spring is almost here, but given the snowbanks, its hard to believe. We are all hoping for a melt soon, a very slow melt, but a melt. Warmer days are ahead. Here is an update on some of the recent activities within the community and by the council.

The pandemic continues to overshadow all of our activities, although we are slowly moving towards fewer restrictions. It all starts with the vaccine, and before the most recent clinic, 67% of the regional population (Teslin and Johnston's Crossing) had received a first and second shot. Although it was below the Yukon Government's goal of 75%, it was, nonetheless, a step forward. Although vaccinations are underway and there are few cases of COVID, it vital that we continue to follow the Safe Six plus One. I realize it is difficult, but if we continue on this path, the Chief Medical Officer has indicated that restrictions will be lessened in the future. As always, please be respectful of the diversity of views around the vaccine and the pandemic. There are no easy answers.

Well, we did something entirely different for our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Mini-Rendezvous, and it was tremendously successful. Moving from a oneweekend event to two weekend plus weeknights proved very popular, and we had some of the best participation in recent memory. Many thanks to Lindsay Johnston for her organizing efforts which started many months ago, and her team of staff and volunteers who worked to pull it off. These events take many hands to be successful, and I would like to thank everyone who stepped up and played a role in this event's success. Given the circumstances of this past year, it was great to see everyone out and doing their best to participate. Many thanks to Sam Johnston, who started Mini-Rendezvous fifty years ago. He told me during the event how amazed he was to be attending the 50<sup>th</sup> event! He provided much wisdom over the months and then jumped in and cracked the whip on us during the pole push. Many thanks, Sam. The Teslin Lakespiel was another popular event that brought a lot of people out. I've concluded that if you are doing a lakespiel in the Yukon, you just need to know that you are going to encounter some weather element. During the week, our staff battled melting ice due to the paint. On day one, participants battled driving snow that accumulated on the ice. On the second day, participants battled a frigid wind flowing uncontested across the lake surface. So, perhaps the type of curling was up to interpretation (it was closer to shuffleboard than curling, and we had some unique throws). However, it seems everyone had a lot of fun, which was the point of the event.

Onto the less exciting, but no less important stuff. We are currently in a territorial election, and I encourage you to listen to each candidate's platform and decide which is best for Teslin. Then, get out and vote! This is a good opportunity to remind you that the municipality is also in an election year, with the election coming in October. I am always proud to let other communities know of our council's diversity, where we have three Tlingit women serving on the council. It is representative of our community and keeps and the rest of us sharp. I hope this continues on the next council. If you are interested in getting involved in our community at the municipal level, I encourage you to run for a council seat. Feel free to ask me questions about my experience on council.

The Official Community Plan and Joint Community Development Plan with TTC identified trail development as a priority for the cultural, recreational, economic, health and safety benefits for Teslin. Recreation was also an important priority for this council, so we initiated the development of a trail plan. This plan was approved last summer, and throughout the planning process, it became apparent that trail planning, development and design should be an ongoing, iterative process for Teslin. In other words, it's going to take several years and constant revision before the trail network is fully developed. This summer, we will be focusing on building on the existing informal trail network that already exists in and around Teslin. More details on this summer's efforts are available at the Village Office. We are happy to discuss them with you. At our Joint Council meeting with TTC in November, we discussed Village of Teslin boundary expansion. This issue is a long outstanding topic of discussion between VOT and TTC, and at the meeting, we both agreed that we want to re-engage in the process. From a municipal perspective, this is about expanding our service delivery area and giving people to opportunity to vote in municipal elections and potentially run for council. It is long overdue. We have several areas that need additional research, which will take a year followed by a year of community consultation before delivering it to the Minister of Community Services and the Municipal Board for approval. This will be a significant step forward for the community
