

Message from the Mayor April 2023

Spring is almost here, and you can feel the renewed energy in the community as we emerge from the deep freeze. Here is an update on matters the Village of Teslin Council has discussed over the past few months.

For those who have not been monitoring the snowfall and snowpack forecasts, everything is looking close to normal range. That means we are unlikely to have a repeat of last year's flooding. However, we will continue with our permanent flood mitigation efforts in the coming weeks, including building a permanent berm on the lakeside of Jackson Avenue. Last year's rising waters threatened several properties along the street, and a lift station, which, if damaged or rendered out of service, would result in all residents on the south side of the community from the Village to the bridge losing access to sewage services. We continue to seek funding for the rest of our Flood Mitigation Plan, which includes berms and dykes in other areas around town to protect the entire community.

Over the winter, we surveyed the community about potential marina upgrades. This larger initiative may take a while to follow through on since it is an expensive project. We wanted to get public input early to ensure we were heading in the right direction. However, we have not secured funding, so it may be a few years before we begin any upgrades.

We are also looking at a possible force water main from the old well in Smarchville to the water treatment plant at the municipal building to increase our water availability. This is to meet growing demand, and expected drinking water needs as the new TTC Community Services Building and the potential TTC green subdivision get nearer to reality. This project is still in its early stages, but there are ongoing discussions with Teslin Tlingit Council, and our staff is gathering information and researching possible funding sources. It is an important initiative to meet the future needs of our community, but taking these projects from conceptual stages to implementation and, finally, completion typically takes several years.

We recently increased our water delivery rates. We had not reviewed or raised our rates in several years and faced rising costs on all things. As a result, we looked closer at the costs of delivering water. This research made us realize we were not recovering enough of our expenses. The increases reflect the actual delivery costs better and are intended to make delivery self-sustaining. We also hope that some residents will decrease the number of deliveries if they do not need them.

In other news, we hope to have our annual community spring steak and chicken BBQ dinner sometime in the coming months. We look forward to having the event for the first time in three years and updating the community on the projects in our Joint Community Development Plan.

As with every newsletter, I greatly thank our staff, who work tirelessly to deliver services daily. Without their dedication, our community would not have the level of services it enjoys. Gord Curran

TESLIN ROADS

Please be cautious driving and walking as conditions can be slippery. Sweeping equipment will be out and about, so be aware and give equipment space to work safely.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday Closed to the public. Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday – Noon to 5:30 pm Saturday – 09:30 am to 4:30 pm

Make sure you stop and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after-hours access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9 am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to the Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

The Village of Teslin Solid Waste Facility operational hours are subject to change over the easter holiday this information will be posted around the community as well as on social media.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All sewer lines are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the sewer system.

TKO Services (Khiel Davies) is providing pump-out services in Teslin please call 334-5636 to schedule your pump-out.

The Village of Teslin will be providing a temporary pump-out service for the community and surrounding area as needed. Please phone TKO first for all pump-out requests as VOT is only providing these services as a last resort.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery.

Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and **accessible for the water truck** and that the path to your fill spout is clear of snow, dog feces, and obstacles.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems comply.

Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

With the increasing demand for water delivery, schedules may be changed from time to time.

The new water bylaw has been passed by Mayor and Council and will come into effect on March 1st. If you have any questions regarding the new bylaw, please reach out to our office.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very seriously and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we continue patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

If you need materials to secure your dog on your property, let us know and we can provide them to you.

If your female dog is in heat, please keep them secure in your yard or home to help avoid dogs packing in groups.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog, please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

PROJECTS

The new fire hall is now complete, and both the Teslin fire department and Teslin EMS are sharing the building.

The Village of Teslin is applying for funding for an upgrade of Rec center buildings.

The equipment for the new playground in the Sawmill Road subdivision has arrived and installation will be completed this spring.

FLOOD

TTC and the Village of Teslin are seeking funding to complete permanent flood measures and are in the planning stages. Community consultation on permanent measures will be ongoing. We will be submitting our project proposal to YESAB please log onto their website to input your thoughts.

OTHER

We are planning for future projects, and we will be doing community consultation please respond as we appreciate community feedback, and your input is considered during decision-making.

The Village of Teslin has received COVID-19 Rapid tests to distribute to residents, if you need a test, please call the office.

Please be considerate when shooting off fireworks, and notify your neighbours or the Village office ahead of time. And set them off at reasonable hours.

Teslin Health Centre News April 2023

APRIL IS CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Cancer causes our otherwise normal cells to get mixed up and produce lumps or tumors. Cancer can also spread through the blood stream to other parts of the body. Most cancers are a result of various risk factors that can be hereditary, lifestyle choices or exposure to cancer-causing substances.

The earlier cancer is found, the easier it is to treat. Get to know your own body and what is normal for you. If you have any concerns, talk to your local doctor or nurse. There is also screening tests that can detect cancer, even if you do not have symptoms.

Breast Cancer: Mammography (a low-dose x-ray) can help find lumps or abnormalities in the breast that you may not be able to feel. If you are 40 or older or have any symptoms, speak with your health care provider about whether breast cancer screening is for you.

Cervical Cancer: A pap test is a test of cells from the cervix, the opening between the vagina and the uterus. The test looks for cells that are not normal and can cause cervical cancer. Most women between the ages 25-69 need regular pap tests. If you are between the ages 9 and 45 years old, you can get the HPV vaccine, which can reduce the risk of cervical cancer. Speak with your health care provider.

Colon Cancer: In the Yukon, colon cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths after lung cancer. A FIT test is a simple cancer screening test that detects blood in a stool sample, which can be a sign of precancer. If you are between the ages of 50-74, or have symptoms, speak with your health care provider.

If you or someone you know has cancer, it is okay to feel uneasy. A range of emotions may be experienced. Please, reach out to your health care provider, family, friends or counsellor to talk about your feelings and to feel supported.

FILIPINO PALITAW RECIPE

Ingredients

- 2 cups glutinous rice flour
- ½ cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup water
- ½ cup sesame seeds roasted
- 1 cup grated coconut



Instructions

- 1. Combine glutinous rice flour with water and mix until a dough is formed.
- 2. Scoop 2 tbsp of dough and mold it into a ball
- 3. Flatten the ball-shaped dough using the palm of your hands.
- 4. Boil water in a cooking pot then put in the flattened dough.
- 5. When the flattened dough starts to float, remove them from the pot and set it aside allowing water to drip.
- 6. Combine sugar and roasted sesame seeds then mix well.
- 7. Roll the rice cake in grated coconut and the sugar-sesame seed mixture.
- 8. Arrange in a serving plate then serve. Share and enjoy!





BRAZILIAN FAROFA RECIPE



Ingredients

- 3 strips smoked bacon, diced
- 1 medium white onion, chopped
- 2 cloves of garlic, minced
- 5 tablespoons butter or vegetable oil
- 2 cups (250 grams) cassava flour
- 1/4 cup parsley, finely chopped
- 1/4 cup chives, finely chopped
- Salt and pepper to taste


Instructions

- 1. In a cold skillet, cook the bacon over medium heat until golden brown.
- 2. Once the fat is rendered, add the butter and cook the bacon until golden brown.
- 3. Add the finely chopped onions and sauté them until transparent.
- 4. Add the garlic and sauté it for a minute.
- 5. Add the cassava flour and stir continuously
- 6. Add salt and pepper to taste, and once the farofa is nicely and evenly toasted, remove it from the heat (around 7 minutes)
- 7. Now, add the parsley and chives and mix well the ingredients.
- 8. Transfer your farofa to a serving plate and serve it at room temperature.
