

Administrative Report March 2024

TESLIN ROADS

Please be cautious driving and walking as conditions can be slippery. As the weather continues to warm, we will be steaming culverts so watch for the crews working. Sweeping equipment will be out and about, so be aware and give equipment space to work safely.

If there are any concerns with the road conditions, please call the office.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday are Closed to the public. Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday – Noon to 5:30 pm Saturday – 09:30 am to 4:30 pm

STOP and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after-hours access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

When disposing of construction waste in the designated pit, please ensure that you drive as far back as possible and deposit the waste into the pit.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9 a.m., Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins. There has been a change to some materials that can be recycled, information about what materials can be recycled will be available soon.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to the Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All sewer lines are in working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the sewer system. We have recertified the lagoon facility and have received an operating permit for an additional five years.

We have been having issues in the sewer system with items being flushed that should not be. Please ensure that you only flush items meant for sewer systems. VOT sent out a poster to help people identify what can and can't be flushed. If you need a copy, you may contact the village office.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

If you plan to be away, kindly inform the office so we can make adjustments to your water delivery schedule. Failing to do so may result in avoidable delivery charges and potential flooding.

- Kindly ensure that spouts and tank whistles are in good working order and that lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.
- Please ensure your driveways are clear and accessible for the water truck and that the path to your fill spout is clean of dog feces, and obstacles.
- The new water truck is in service delivering water. Our annual report for 2023 has been submitted to Yukon Water Resources and Environmental Health.
- When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems comply.
- With the increasing demand for water delivery, schedules may be changed from time to time.
- If you have any questions regarding the new bylaw, please reach out to our office.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very seriously and are actively pursuing loose dogs. Our public works staff patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we continue patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

- If you need materials to secure your dog on your property, let us know and we can provide them to you.
- If your female dog is in heat, please keep them secure in your yard or home to help avoid dogs packing in groups.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with the Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog, please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

- The landfill scale project is currently under construction and this project will be finished in the spring.
- TTC and the Village of Teslin are seeking funding to complete permanent flood measures and are in the planning and permitting stages.
- In collaboration with TTC, we are actively developing a community wildfire protection plan. Your feedback is very important to us, so please respond to any questionnaires.

Spring update

From the Nisutlin Bay Bridge team, Government of Yukon

Hello Teslin! We wanted to provide you with an update on what's been happening on the Nisutlin Bay Bridge replacement project lately.

This winter, you may have noted significant progress made on the bridge. Three of six concrete piers are now finished while work continues on the remaining three.



This t-shaped structure called a pier is a permanent piece of the new bridge. Three of six piers are now complete.

This spring, steel beams will be installed between the piers followed by construction of the bridge deck.

We'd like to highlight the work of the diving team. Their work involves removing silt and debris underwater to allow construction. In these cold temperatures, that's no easy job!

We would also like to acknowledge the continued commitment by Environmental Dynamics Inc. (EDI) and the Teslin Tlingit Council (TTC) for their ongoing work to minimize impacts to the environment and to protect fish and water quality.

EDI has been hired to collect any fish that have been found in work areas and relocate them safely back into the bay. They also monitor underwater noise levels during piling activities. We're also working closely with TTC staff to review plans and adjust operations when required to minimize any impact on the environment.



We were then off to Kloo Lake, outside of Haines Junction, for our **Youth Bison Hunt** with a group of 7 youth and 4 adults. Despite a few little hiccups like extreme winds blowing the boys wall tent off during the 1st night (and having to scramble the group inside the cabin), sick kids, and a broken-down skidoo it was our FIRST SUCCESSFUL HUNT!! Steve Kremer and Roger Smarch were able to travel ahead of the core group on the 2nd day of the hunt to scout out an area we heard the bison were in, and came back with news of the successful harvest of 2 cows. Given the time of day and split up of the group, we all travelled back to camp together for the night before returning the next day to quarter and bring home the harvest. Youth helped start a fire, skin and pack meat while a lot of wet snow fell. It was a cold but accomplished ride back to camp for our last night rib (pork) feast. Camp tear down and clean up went well and we were headed back to Teslin on March 17.We hung the meat in Rogers cache for a day and then cut up and ground our meat with the help of camp participants and several community members on March 18. Thanks to funding from Teslin Renewable Resource Council and Youth Developmental Asset Program (YDAP), the Youth Bison Hunt was a huge success with the harvest being shared amongst participants and rec program freezers.

The **First Assist Hockey Program** wrapped up with a fun bonus week that included a skills competition and parents game the week of March 18. It was really great to have coach Aleks in our community for 9 weeks and we noticed a big difference in the youth who participated both on and off the ice. We are eagerly moving funds around to be able to do a short run of the program to kick off next hockey season, and will seek out the funding to run the full program again in Winter 2025. Even more emphasis will be put on school commitment moving ahead and we can't wait to see the further development of our 'student-athletes' here in Teslin. Thank you to the Crime Prevention Victim Services Trust Fund (CPVST) for supporting this program!!!



Dear Teslin Community Organizations;

FOODSAFE Level 1 is an online food handling, sanitation and work safety course designed for front-line food service workers such as cooks, servers, bussers, dishwashers, and deli workers. This is usually a requirement for anyone in the food service, even casually.

This course covers: Causes of foodborne illness, microbes and foodborne illness, food safety plans and HACCP, food handler health and hygiene, receiving and storing food safely, preparing food safely, serving food safely, cleaning, sanitizing and pest control, premises requirements.

Learners have 20 days to complete this seven-hour course. You can take the course at home or use the Teslin campus computer access.


