Message From The Mayor December 2023

Here is an update on matters the Village of Teslin Council has discussed over the past month.

We are currently shorthanded in almost every aspect of our operation, although we are making strides in returning to being fully staffed. I appreciate everyone's patience and understanding with our staff who are currently carrying extra loads. We have an extremely dedicated and hard-working staff. Feel free to call me if you have any concerns or complaints.

We are continuing to work on our emergency measures planning with permanent flood measures starting in the spring. The berm we planned to complete along Jackson Avenue last year was delayed and will get underway this spring. In collaboration with TTC, we are securing more funding to build additional permanent measures on TTC lands. We will also be watching the snowfall closely this winter. As for wildfire management, we are working on operationalizing our Joint Community Wildfire Protection Plan. As part of that plan, we are also trying to secure funding to re-cut the firebreak north of the community near the Sawmill subdivision. You also have a role to play. We are planning on hosting some workshops on home firesmarting in the spring. Stay tuned.

As with almost every message in the past six months, loose dogs remain an issue. This is a reminder that people must keep their dogs in their yards. Remember that your Snoopy may be someone else's Cujo. According to our *Animal Control Bylaw*, animals cannot "run at large" off their owner's property. Your dog can be loose, but it must stay on your property. If you see a dog wandering loose, please call the Village of Teslin office at (867) 390-2530.

Please enjoy the various activities in the community in December. Since moving here, I've always been impressed by the engagement of the community around Christmas and the amount of activities available to everyone. Please enjoy these events safely and take time to be with family.

As with every newsletter, I greatly thank our staff, who work tirelessly to deliver services daily, especially recently with us being shorthanded. Without their dedication, our community would not have the level of services it enjoys.

Administrative Report

November 2023

TESLIN ROADS

The weather has been unusual for this time of year. Please be cautious walking and driving as it can make for very slippery conditions. Winter road maintenance equipment will be out working in the coming weeks, and we ask that you give all road maintenance equipment lots of space to work safely.

If there are any concerns with the road conditions, please call the office.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday are Closed to the public.

Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday – Noon to 5:30 pm

Saturday – 09:30 am to 4:30 pm

Make sure you stop and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after-hours access to the facility, so please plan accordingly.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9 a.m. Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins. There has been a change to some materials that can be recycled; information about what materials can be recycled will be available soon.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to the Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to practice recycling at home and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All sewer lines are in working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the sewer system.

We have been having issues in the sewer system with items being flushed that should not be. Please ensure that you only flush items meant for sewer systems. VOT will send out a poster to help people identify what can and cannot be flushed.

TKO Services (Khiel Davies) is providing pump-out services in Teslin. Please call them at (867) 334-5636 to schedule your pump-out.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

Please notify us if you will be away and do not require water delivery.

Kindly ensure that spouts and tank whistles are in good working order and that lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and **accessible for the water truck** and that the path to your fill spout is clean of dog feces and obstacles.

The Village of Teslin is expecting delivery of our new water truck in early December.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings, please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems comply.

With the increasing demand for water delivery, schedules may be changed from time to time.

If you have any questions regarding the new bylaw, please reach out to our office.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very seriously and are actively pursuing loose dogs. Our public works staff patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week, and we continue patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

If you need materials to secure your dog on your property, let us know, and we can provide them to you.

If your female dog is in heat, please keep them secure in your yard or home to help avoid dogs packing in groups.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog, please give us a call, and we can assist with making arrangements.

PROJECTS

The energy upgrades to the Village of Teslin's municipal administration building are on schedule and is due for completion by the end of December.

The landfill scale project is currently under construction and this project will be finished in the spring.

TTC and the Village of Teslin are seeking funding to complete permanent flood measures and are in the planning and permitting stages.

If you think that there is an important project that you think the Village of Teslin should consider. Don't hesitate to drop us a line; we want to hear your suggestion.

Our **Parents & Tots** program continues to happen weekly on Saturdays at 1:30p. November featured a couple special sessions, including an Animal Costume Party (so cute), and art afternoon. More fun to come.

Drop-In Basketball remains super popular on Friday nights with the time now being shared by two different age groups. Our under-10/beginner group has been given a time slot of 6:45p-7:30pm, and the older and more skilled players play from 7:30-9pm.

Tuesdays and Thursdays are **hockey night** in Teslin with the Teslin Aces minor program running from 5:45-7:15p and the adults taking the ice after. **Instant Pot
Pork Puttanesca**

Instant Pot Pork Puttanesca

Ingredients

- **3 1/2 lb.** skinless, boneless pork shoulder, excess fat trimmed and discarded, pork cut into 2" pieces
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- **1 tbsp.** extra-virgin olive oil
- **6** cloves garlic, peeled
- **2** oil-packed anchovy fillets
- **1/4 c.** tomato paste
- **1** (28-oz.) can whole peeled tomatoes
- **1/3 c.** pitted Castelvetrano and/or kalamata olives, halved
- **1/4 c.** packed fresh basil leaves, roughly chopped, plus more for serving
- **2 tbsp.** red wine vinegar
- **1 tbsp.** capers, drained
- **1/2 tsp.** crushed red pepper flakes
- **1/2 tsp.** granulated sugar
- Cooked polenta and shaved Parmesan, for serving

Directions:

1. Season Pork with $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon salt and $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon Black pepper.
2. In an Instant pot, heat oil on Sauté for 2 minutes. Add garlic and cook, stirring frequently until light golden, about 2 minutes. Stir in anchovies and tomato paste and cook, stirring, until tomato paste slightly darkens and anchovies are broken up into small bits, about 2 minutes
3. Add tomatoes and any juices, breaking up tomatoes with a wooden spoon. Add olives, basil, vinegar, capers, red pepper flakes, and sugar.
4. Close and lock lid. Cook on high pressure 30 minutes, or until pork is very tender.
5. Manually release pressure. Using tongs, transfer pork to a large bowl. Using 2 forks, shred pork. Return pork to pot with sauce and set to Sauté. Bring to a simmer and cook, stirring occasionally, until sauce thickens, 8 to 10 minutes more.
6. Serve pork over polenta. Top with Parmesan and basil.



Christmas Crack

Ingredients:

- 1 cup (227g) unsalted or salted butter
- 1 cup (220g) packed light or dark brown sugar
- 40 salted saltine crackers (about 1 sleeve)
- 1 pkg (270-300g) milk or semi-sweet chocolate chips
- Additional toppings nuts, candy or sprinkles (optional)

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350F. Line a large baking sheet with heavy-duty aluminum foil (if using regular foil, spray with non-stick cooking spray for easy removal). Spread the crackers out on the foil in a single layer and fold up the edges of the foil to box in the crackers. Set aside.
2. In a medium saucepan, melt the butter and brown sugar over medium heat on the stovetop. Bring to a rolling boil. Reduce the heat to medium-low and continue to boil for 5

minutes (set a timer), stirring frequently. Quickly pour over the crackers and spread to cover completely.

3. Bake for 5 minutes in the oven. Turn off heat. Remove from oven and immediately sprinkle the chocolate chips on top.

4. Let stand for 1-2 minutes or until the chocolate starts to look shiny and is soft enough spread evenly over the toffee. If the chocolate is still not warm enough to spread after 4 minutes, place it back in the oven for a minute to help soften it.

5. Top with any additional toppings if desired.

6. Chill in the refrigerator for about 2 hours to harden. Peel away the foil and break into pieces.

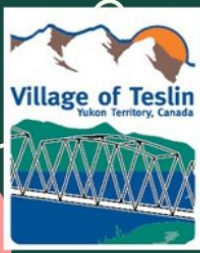

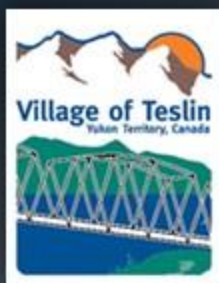

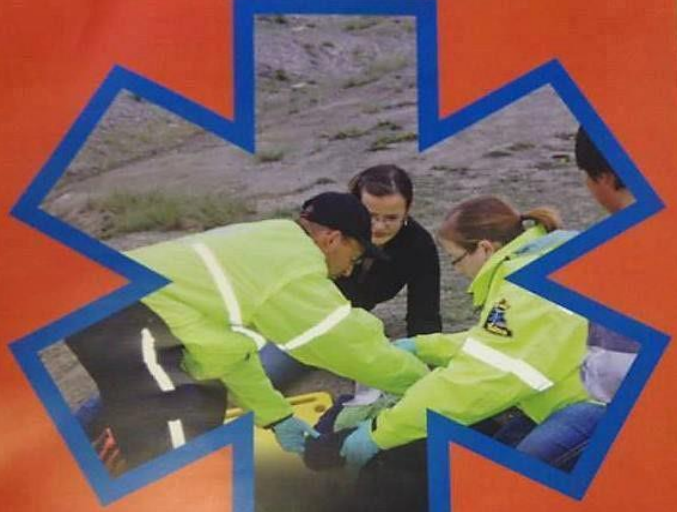
