



Roads are in winter driving conditions, please drive with caution. Airport Connector Road is closed for the season.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Monday, Tuesday Closed to public Wednesday—Thursday and Friday — Noon to 6:00pm Saturday — 10:00 am — 5:00 pm

This is a great time to remind people you can purchase a landfill punch card for \$20.00 at the Village office.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

The recycling center is open for refundables, though customers will have to sort and count their own recycling while the attendant observes.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.


Lighting Up Memories







Providing business equity 'matching' grants by DDC of up to \$10,000 per entrepreneur (until annual allocated budget used). Applications are accepted from entrepreneurs with business proposals approved by DNV for financing from the CanNor Entrepreneur & Business Development (EBD) program.

Teslin Affordable Rental Housing Development

The DDC conducted two surveys in Teslin and one of the issues identified was that the lack of stable housing is the number one barrier to attracting and retaining people in the community long-term, building skills, careers and self-reliance. As such DDC drafted the Teslin Affordable Rental Housing Development Business Case and the Business Case Summary and posted both on our website early in 2020.

The DDC retained Taylor Architecture Group to provide options for the design and construction of five individual one-bedroom housing units on a single lot in Teslin. The Final Report once approved by the Board of Directors will be sent to the Teslin Tlingit Council and Village of Teslin for discussion and posted to the DDC website at ddc-teslin.com.

DDC Project Managed during 2020 the:

Dangerous Trees Project – Teslin Residents attended at the DDC office identifying danger trees in their yards that they wished to have removed. An Arborist from Carcross, YT was retained to top or remove identified trees and a TTC Contractor (who hired 2 citizens) was retained to remove trees and brush and take to either the Bio-Mass Yard or the Teslin Landfill. 215 trees were either topped or removed.

Abandoned Vehicle Project – Teslin Residents attended at the DDC office to submit requests to have derelict vehicles removed from their yards and taken to the Teslin Landfill. A Request for Expressions of Interest for qualified contractors/individuals was posted around the community. Two Contractors responded to the posting (one TTC contractor and one non-TTC). The contractors split the list in half. 92 abandoned vehicles were removed (environmentally safe removal).

Charles Jules Subdivision Road Upgrade - DDC was retained by TTC to manage all engineering reports and all the construction of the upgrade to the road at the Charles Jules Duplex Road. Two local contractors were retained to do the work on the upgrade.

FireSmart 2020 - DDC project manages the FireSmart program for both the Village of Teslin and the Teslin Tlingit Council. Six sawyers/slashers were retained and 5 hectares were cleared and brushed on the Sawmill Road.

TTC Slashing Projects – 6 sawyers/slashers were retained to clear land on short projects and two TTC Contractors were retained for equipment use.



DDC is currently in the drafting stage of developing the DDC Procurement Policy which includes Appendix A – Teslin Tlingit and Local Economic Benefits Policy. This policy will apply to all procurement by DDC and all our subsidiary corporations including Lighting Fire Management and Teslin Environmental Service. Once the draft is finalized and approved by the Board of Directors it will be posted on the DDC Website.



Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door


Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.



- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children.
 Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.




