Roads are in winter driving conditions. Watch for equipment plowing snow. Please take your time and drive accordingly.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Monday, Tuesday Closed to public Wednesday—Thursday and Friday — Noon to 6:00pm Saturday — 10:00 am — 5:00 pm

Make sure you stop and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Recycling center is open to the public, though people are asked to count their own recycling.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and accessible for the water truck and the path to your fill spout is clear of snow and obstacles.

With the increasing demand for water delivery schedules may changed from time to time.

DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we are now patrolling in the evenings. Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse

Message from the Mayor February 2022

Sorry for missing fall and early winter Teslin Posts. We had a municipal election in October, and then November and December got busy. Below is an update on our new council and other activities.

Our new council started their term on October 25th with swearing-in and orientation. Congratulations to returning councillors Trevor Sallis and Juanita Kremer and new councillors Jeff Myke and Luc Johnstone. Our priorities this term are recreation, food security, and the marina. As part of recreation, our youth continues to be an important focus. Since our first meeting, our new council has proven to be an active group with some very well-rounded discussions on issues facing the community.

The COVID pandemic continues to overshadow everything as

we move into yet another phase with the re-introduction of the Civil State of Emergency, the current Omicron outbreak, and changes to testing. As a result of the testing changes, it is difficult to know how many cases we have locally. The numbers were always a little off at the best of times since not everyone who was sick was getting tested, and some people had Teslin addresses but were not physically in Teslin. With the rapid spread of the Omicron variant, it is safe that you should assume that COVID is in the community. Please follow the Safe Six plus One and consider getting the vaccine and boosters if you have not already done so. This phase emphasizes strong individual awareness of your behaviour and the wishes of others, and there are diverse opinions about the vaccine and the pandemic. We ask that you remain respectful of other community members, and above all, be careful, respectful, and kind to one another.

Recreation remains a focus and a priority. As the pandemic continues, our community's mental health is a growing concern. We have long thought that the impact of the pandemic is not only the medical threat posed by COVID but the erosion of the mental health of our community. It is increasingly difficult to be optimistic as this pandemic closes in on two years, and we feel that recreation is one of the best ways to improve mental health and counteract the impact of the pandemic. Furthermore, feeling a connection to others is as important as the physical benefits of recreation. Please take advantage of what we are offering, and be respectful of the guidelines and restrictions we need to follow. Although the restrictions introduced over the past few months make it challenging, our determined and creative Recreation Manager Lindsay Johnston continues to offer the community great recreational opportunities. Please take advantage of them.

Our new fire hall continues to be built and is clearly visible from Alaska Highway beside the Deisleen Development Corporation offices. The project is progressing well and is slated to be completed by October 2022. The federally-funded project is managed by Colliers and overseen by Cole Hunking from VOT Public Works.

In closing, I would like to extend a big thanks to our staff who work tirelessly behind the scenes to deliver services under challenging circumstances. Day in and day out, they are committed to making a difference in Teslin. As a council, we can make all the decisions we want, but it means nothing without the dedicated team who work daily to make this community a better place to live.




