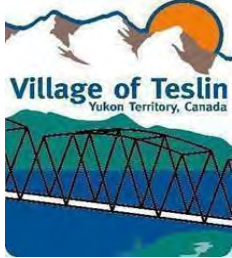

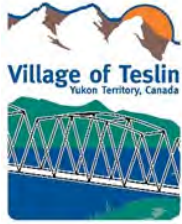

Message from the Mayor February 2024

Here is an update on matters the Village of Teslin Council has discussed over the past month.

We continue to work on our emergency measures planning with permanent flood measures starting in the spring. We will be constructing a berm along Jackson Avenue. We initially scheduled this work for last summer but postponed it due to permitting delays. We continue to work with TTC to secure funding to build additional permanent measures on TTC lands. We will also watch the snowfall closely this winter, especially the snow amounts in the mountains.

As for wildfire management, we are working on operationalizing our Joint Community Wildfire Protection Plan. As part of that plan, we are also trying to secure funding to re-cut the firebreak north of the community near the Sawmill subdivision. You also have a role to play. We plan to host some workshops on home fire smarting in the spring. We will also have other workshops and information as we finalize details. Stay tuned.

We are also working on adding a subdivision sprinkler system and providing training to our fire department to provide us with some first-attack capabilities. Finding funding for the equipment is an issue, but our staff are working on it.

We are working with Teslin Tlingit Council on a water tank upgrade program. As you know, we added a fee to water delivery last year. The Council recognizes that tank size is a significant barrier for households that consume larger amounts of water weekly. This program will replace the small tanks with larger tanks to reduce delivery costs for the consumer. Priority will be given to those that receive frequent weekly deliveries. As staff work out the details, more information about the program will be released in the coming months. We are also working on a self-fill tank option at the water treatment plant. However, this project requires a lot more work before it becomes a reality.

We recently added some new staff, so if you see an unfamiliar face working for us, please say hello and introduce yourself. We are recruiting a new Chief Administrative Officer and hope to have someone in place this month.

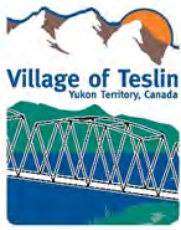

Administrative Report

January 2024

TESLIN ROADS

Please be cautious walking and driving as winter road maintenance equipment will be out working in the coming weeks. Please ensure you give all road maintenance equipment lots of space to work safely.

If there are any concerns with the road conditions, please call the office.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday are Closed to the public.

Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday – Noon to 5:30 pm

Saturday – 09:30 am to 4:30 pm

STOP and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after-hours access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

When disposing of construction waste in the designated pit, please ensure that you drive as far back as possible and deposit the waste into the pit.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9 a.m. Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins. There has been a change to some materials that can be recycled, information about what materials can be recycled will be available soon.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to the Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All sewer lines are in working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the sewer system.

We have been having issues in the sewer system with items being flushed that should not be. Please ensure that you only flush items meant for sewer systems. VOT will send out a poster to help people identify what can and can't be flushed.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

If you plan to be away, kindly inform the office to so we can make adjustments to your water delivery schedule. Failing to do so may result in avoidable delivery charges and potential flooding.

Kindly ensure that spouts and tank whistles are in good working order and that lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and **accessible for the water truck** and that the path to your fill spout is clean of dog feces, and obstacles.

We have received our new water truck we are just waiting for the final permit from public health to put it into operation.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems comply.

With the increasing demand for water delivery, schedules may be changed from time to time.

If you have any questions regarding the new bylaw, please reach out to our office.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very seriously and are actively pursuing loose dogs. Our public works staff patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we continue patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

If you need materials to secure your dog on your property, let us know and we can provide them to you.

If your female dog is in heat, please keep them secure in your yard or home to help avoid dogs packing in groups.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with the Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog, please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

PROJECTS

The Village of Teslin's Municipal Administration building is on schedule and is due for completion by the end of February.

The landfill scale project is currently under construction and this project will be finished in the spring.

TTC and the Village of Teslin are seeking funding to complete permanent flood measures and are in the planning and permitting stages.

If you think that there is an important project that you think the Village of Teslin should consider. Don't hesitate to drop us a line, we want to hear your suggestion.

In collaboration with TTC, we are actively developing a community wildfire protection plan. Join us for an upcoming public session at the recreation center on February 7th. Your input is highly valued, and surveys will be available for you to provide your thoughts. Please take the time to fill them out.

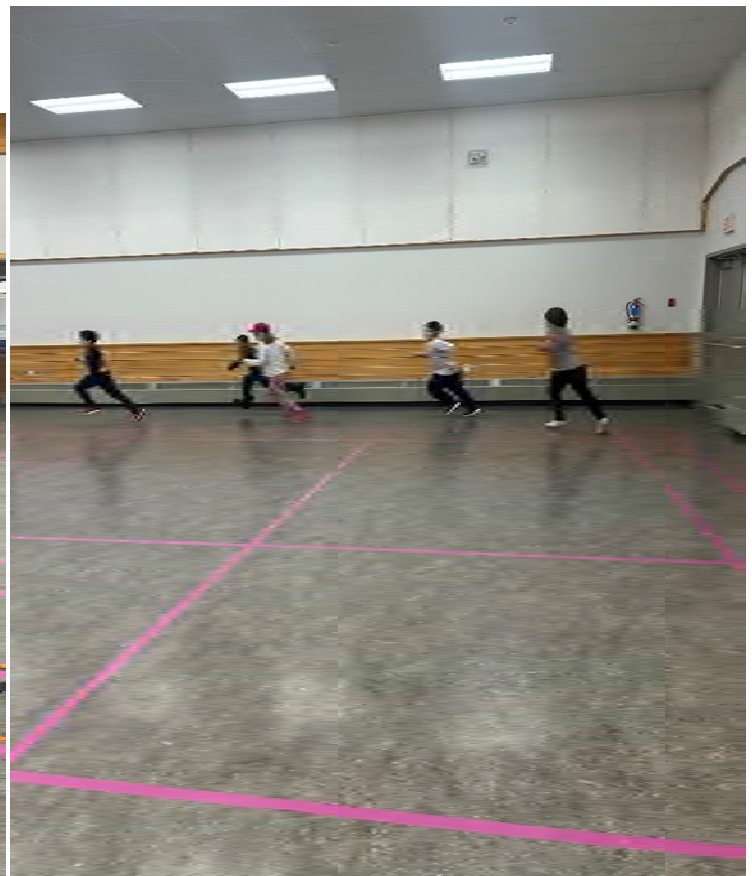

Water Tank

Upgrade Grant

- Who is eligible:** Anyone who owns their home and receives water delivery between Fox Point & Boville.
- What this resolves:** Council recognizes the need to reduce the frequency of water deliveries to lower costs for consumers. One of the major barriers, specifically for households that consume larger amounts of water weekly, is tank size. This program will replace the small tanks with larger tanks to reduce delivery costs for the consumer. Priority will be given to those that receive frequent weekly deliveries.
- Installation Location:** The tank will be placed underground and insulated. Your existing tank will be removed, freeing up space in your home.
- When to apply:** The application will be available at the VOT office on February 14, 2024. You will need to submit your application no later than March 31, 2024. The upgrades will start in the spring/summer of 2024, with 15 tanks to be installed this year. We anticipate this program continuing for future years.

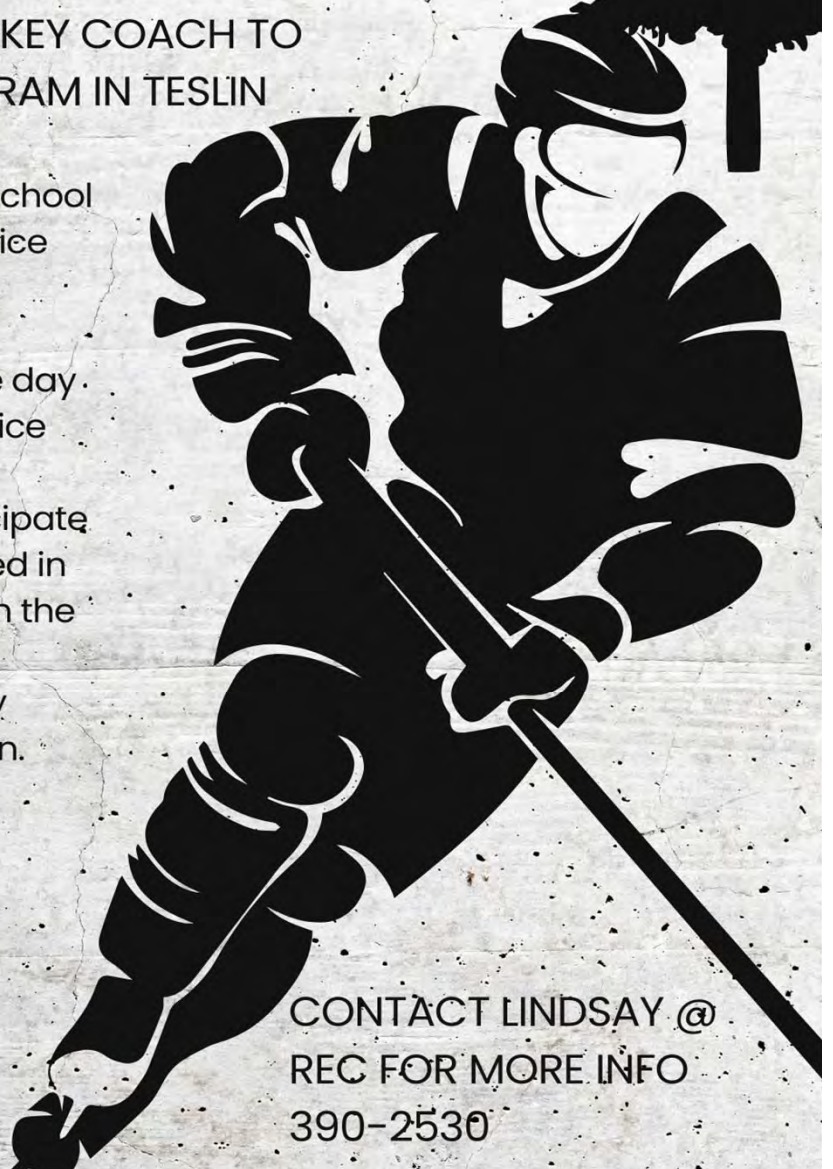

The snowmobile operator's certificate provides hands-on training on the safe operation, handling, and inspection of snowmobiles. The course uses a combination of field and classroom activities to help the rider develop safe and effective snowmobile operation habits.

The course curriculum includes understanding risks associated with snowmobile operation, risk management techniques, planning for snowmobile outings (survival considerations and field maintenance), and pre-ride inspections, field troubleshooting, and review of controls. Exercises in basic riding skills, including riding positions, cornering, traversing hills, trail riding, and handling obstacles, are also covered.

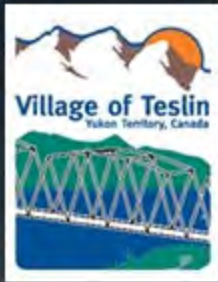
