### **COMMUNITY EVENTS**

Community Hayride was held on December 13<sup>th</sup> the weather cooperated which contributed to the amazing turnout for the evening! The lighting contest was also successful and we gave away 5 prizes.

#### **TESLIN ROADS**

Roads are in winter driving condition.

### **SOLID WASTE FACILITY (LANDFILL)**

The landfill fees and fines are listed in the Teslin Post, available at the Village office, posted at the landfill and on our website. If you would like to review the bylaw please stop by or call the Village Office.

The bin system is ready to go! Construction waste, metal, and appliance areas of the landfill will be closed to the public and the public will drop these waste streams into designated bins that are setup near the household waste bin. Arrangements can be made with the Village office for commercial vehicles to continue have access to the designated areas.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

#### LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful on what is being flushed down the system. Cleaning and inspecting of the sewer lines has begun is complete and we are reviewing all inspection videos and will be planning scheduled maintenance repairs for next season.

### WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

We have trained more staff on our water truck and delivery system so we have a few backup operators to help ensure our delivery system operates smoothly.

With the changing weather please keep your driveway accessible for the water truck.

The water truck broke down during deliveries on Boxing Day and has been sent to Inland Kenworth repair. We are using the old water truck until the new one is repaired and returned to Teslin.



### DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

### RECREATION BUILDINGS

Winter programming is in full swing check out the recreation calendar. Regular programming took a break during the holidays but will be in full swing again once the holidays are over.

If you would like to register for Adult hockey please call the Village office.

Due to low usage of the curling rink we will not be installing ice this fall, we would consider installing ice after December if there is interest in curling.

#### **PROJECTS**

The light replacement project is now complete, the recreation center, arena and municipal center lights have been replaced with high efficient lights.

The drainage project began this fall and will continue over the next few months.

We are designing a new webpage and it should be up and running next month.

We are presently down one permanent staff; advertising for this position will be out in early January.

911 is working in Teslin if you have a fire emergency you can call 911 or 390-2222 to reach our volunteer fire department.

Marina is closed for the season.

Year end is fast approaching our auditors will be here in February so next month we will be busy preparing for their arrival.

Work on the 2018 budget has begun and will be presented to Council in February.



Tyson the cat is on his way home after an extended stay in Teslin and short stay at the VOT Shop.


The cat's owners live in New Mexico and were very surprised to learn he's alive.

## **Teslin Landfill Notice**



### **Hours of operation**

Thursday & Friday 12:00 PM – 5:30 PM Saturday 10:00 AM – 4:30 PM Sun-Wed CLOSED

### The Teslin landfill only accepts these items on a regular basis.

Starting September 28, 2017, the Village of Teslin is implementing a new bin system at the Teslin transfer station. This system will help us meet our permit requirements by; keeping materials sorted, being able to track volumes of each waste stream, improve safety and predict upcoming costs.

Construction waste, metal, and appliance areas of the landfill will be closed to the public and the public will drop these waste streams into designated bins that are set up near the household waste bins. Arrangements can be made with the Village office for commercial vehicles to continue to have access to the designated areas.

- Household Garbage
- **Clean Metal** Metal products by themselves with **NO** other products attached, rubber, wood, plastic, etc.
- Cars-NO fluids and NO tires otherwise a handling fee will be charged
- Tires Tires on rims will be charged a sorting and handling fee of \$10.00
  - I. 19" rim and smaller tire (no charge)
  - II. 20" rim and larger tire (\$32.00)
- Electronic Waste Computers, radios, TV's or any other electronic device
- Compost All organic waste
- Construction Waste –Construction waste deemed as special waste will not be accepted
- **Burnables** Brush, Scrap lumber, yard trimmings, etc.
- Recycle Center All non-refundable recycling has to be sorted in bins at the recycling center. All refundable recyclables will be counted at the recycling center.

Any larger items or any products not listed above will have to be brought to the Village of Teslin's attention prior to being dropped off at the landfill. If you are unsure of any items call the Village of Teslin and we will tell you if we can accept them at the landfill.

Dumping fees are attached and posted at the landfill or can be found in the Teslin Post

### Special Waste

### Trappers:


We are looking for tanned and untanned furs to be sold. We are creating a chart of price ranges by species to ensure good and consistent prices for trappers- you can price your furs in that range (damaged furs can be lower). They will be higher then auction prices.

There are auction receiving dates in mid April and early May, so if you wish to leave hides untanned, unsold furs can still be sent to auction. The Yukon Trapper's Association will be onsite, so buyers can sent furs for tanning right from the event.

Tanned pelts will likely sell better, particularly beaver. Crafters would be likely be interested in slightly or very damaged furs as well as prime furs, and buyers may love fur colours that get lower prices at the auction.

### Crafters:

It is up to you to set your prices, you know the market the best. As this is a fur event, please bring only your goods made with fur on them. Please label the furs used on each item.



### **Scotland**

In Scotland, New Year's Eve — also called "Hogmanay" — is celebrated by giving gifts of shortbread to friends and neighbours.



### Peru

In Peru, traditional belief holds that you can foretell the financial future of the new year by using a potato. Three potatoes are placed under a chair or couch — one unpeeled, one peeled and one half-peeled — with one potato selected at random exactly at midnight. Picking a peeled potato signifies a year with no money, a half-peeled potato means you can expect a typical year, while an unpeeled potato predicts a monetary windfall.



### The American South

In the American South, blackeyed peas are typically eaten on New Year's Day in the belief that consuming them will bring luck in the new year.





### **Holland**

Dutch tradition holds that eating any ring-shaped treat (such as a doughnut) symbolizes coming full circle, which will lead to good fortune in the year to come.

### Greece

When the clock strikes midnight in Greece, you should smash a pomegranate on the floor right in front of the door, breaking it open and revealing its seeds. The seeds symbolize prosperity and good luck; the more seeds you see, the more luck you'll have.



### **Spain**

As the clock chimes 12 times at midnight in Spain and Portugal, it's believed that eating 12 grapes (symbolizing the 12 months of the year) will bring good luck, with one grape consumed at the precise moment of each chime.



### **Bolivia**

In Bolivia, coins are baked into cakes and pastries, and it's believed the person receiving the coins once the cake is cut up will enjoy prosperity in the coming year.

### **Switzerland**

In Swiss homes, whipped cream or ice cream is eaten (which are meant to symbolize the richness of the coming year), with a small dollop dropped on the floor and allowed to remain there.



### **France**

On New Year's Eve, the French celebrate with a special feast, called Le Réveillon de la Saint-Sylvestre, featuring traditional dishes such as pancakes and foie gras along with champagne, with this meal believed to bring prosperity and good luck all who attend the feast

### Russia

A Russian New Year's custom is to write down a wish for the coming year on a piece of paper, then burn the paper and place the ashes in a glass of champagne. In order for the wish to come true, the champagne must be guzzled with before the New Year is rung in.



### **Estonia**

Estonians eat seven meals on New Year's Eve, a superstition that is believed to ensure an abundance of food in the coming year.

### Ireland

An ancient Irish tradition is to bang loaves of bread on the walls of the house in order to chase away evil spirits and invite good spirits in for the year to come.





### Chile

Chileans eat lentils when the clock strikes midnight, believing that eating them will usher in a prosperous new year.
