

TESLIN ROADS

Please be cautious walking and driving as winter road maintenance equipment will be out working in the coming weeks. Please ensure you give all road maintenance equipment lots of space to work safely.

If there are any concerns with the road conditions, please call the office.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday are Closed to the public. Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday – Noon to 5:30 pm Saturday – 09:30 am to 4:30 pm

STOP and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after-hours access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9 a.m. Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins. There has been a change to some materials that can be recycled, information about what materials can be recycled will be available soon.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to the Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All sewer lines are in working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the sewer system.

We have been having issues in the sewer system with items being flushed that should not be. Please ensure that you only flush items meant for sewer systems. VOT will send out a poster to help people identify what can and can't be flushed.

TKO Services (Khiel Davies) is providing pump-out services in Teslin please call 334-5636 to schedule your pump-out.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

Please notify us if you will be away and do not require water delivery.

Kindly ensure that spouts and tank whistles are in good working order and that lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and **accessible for the water truck** and that the path to your fill spout is clean of dog feces, and obstacles.

The Village of Teslin is expecting delivery of our new water truck in early December.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems comply. With the increasing demand for water delivery, schedules may be changed from time to time.

If you have any questions regarding the new bylaw, please reach out to our office.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very seriously and are actively pursuing loose dogs. Our public works staff patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we continue patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

If you need materials to secure your dog on your property, let us know and we can provide them to you.

If your female dog is in heat, please keep them secure in your yard or home to help avoid dogs packing in groups.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with the Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog, please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

PROJECTS

The Village of Teslin's Municipal Administration building is on schedule and is due for completion by the end of December.

The landfill scale project is currently under construction and this project will be finished in the spring.

TTC and the Village of Teslin are seeking funding to complete permanent flood measures and are in the planning and permitting stages.

Thanks to funding from the Yukon Government Crime Prevention Victim Services Trust Fund (CPVST), we are very excited to be welcoming guest facilitator and hockey coach Aleks, who will be coming to us all the way from Serbia to run our 8-week **First Assist Program.** *First Assist* is an Indigenous Run Charity with the goal of advancing educational outcomes in Indigenous communities through sport. 

Snowmobile Operator Safety Course

Are you interested in taking a one-day snowmobile operator's certificate?

The snowmobile operator's certificate provides hands-on training on the safe operation, handling, and inspection of snowmobiles. The course uses a combination of field and classroom activities to help the rider develop safe and effective snowmobile operation habits.

The course curriculum includes understanding risks associated with snowmobile operation, risk management techniques, planning for snowmobile outings (survival considerations and field maintenance), and pre-ride inspections, field troubleshooting, and review of controls. Exercises in basic riding skills, including riding positions, cornering, traversing hills, trail riding, and handling obstacles, are also covered.



How does a mop head end up in the sewer system?

When materials that are not meant to be handled by the system get into the sewer, it causes problems. The grinder pump chops up the material coming through the system, but when a non-flushable item comes through, it can cause an overload or clog the grinder rings.


