

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Monday, Tuesday Closed to public Wednesday—Thursday and Friday — Noon to $6:00 \, \mathrm{pm}$ Saturday — $10:00 \, \mathrm{am} - 5:00 \, \mathrm{pm}$

As of May 1^{st,} all areas of our landfill were open, fees are being charged.

This is a great time to remind people you can purchase a landfill punch card for \$20.00 at the Village office.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

The recycling center is open for refundables, though customers will have to sort and count their own recycling while the attendant observes.

The blue bin recycling pick up program has resumed, please ensure your bins are at the end of your driveway by 9 am.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

Our water licence is due in 2020 so work has begun on gathering information to apply for our new licence.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

We have received numerous complaints about dogs running at large in the Fox Point subdivision we are actively pursuing loose dogs in the area.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements

We also kicked off the **Youth Softball program** in June and will continue this throughout the summer. This is a registration-based program running on Mondays from 3-4pm for ages 6-11. June 2020 Recreation Report

We are also super excited to be working on a **Bike Park** behind the Rec Plex! The park will be open to the public in early July.

We have started up a **Junior Golf Club** for ages 9+ and have had a handful of youth participate in our first couple trips to the driving range in Whitehorse. The goal is to get them a bit more experience before hitting the course for 9 or 18 holes later in the summer.

Sadly we have had all of the guest facilitated camps (such as the Monkey Business gymnastics camp and Circus Camp) cancel for this summer as a result of COVID restrictions. We are still holding on to hope that our over night camping trips and Nisutlin River trip will be able to go ahead later in the summer and working on other programs around town in the meantime.

We have adapted the **Girls Canoe Camp** (which could not take place as an overnight camping trip due to COVID restrictions), to run as day trips from Teslin on June 29 & 30. The goal of the program is to gain the paddle skills and leadership fundamentals to safely have fun in canoes and will be led by Paddle Canada instructor Jane Vincent. We will also kick off the **Warriors of the Water (WOW) Canoe Program** with the help of Jane providing some canoe leadership instruction. **WOW** will be a precursor program to our Nisutlin River Trip (hopefully able to happen later in the summer) and will run Thursdays, alternating between some indoor trip planning sessions and canoe day trips. This program is for mature youth.

Our programs will continue to abide by the 'safe 6' COVID guidelines. Since this means restricted group sizes, most programs will be registration based. We will also have to ensure appropriate distancing of participants, regular hand washing and disinfecting throughout the program.... which does still limit us a bit in what we can offer for now.

We still have not had much participation from the older youth....so wondering where they are...what they are doing... and what programs they would be interested in???

As we continue to navigate the COVID waters in our programming, we will stick with releasing schedules weekly (versus our normal monthly calendar). Message from the Mayor

As you all know, we are amid a pandemic, although the situation is stabilizing. On behalf of the Village of Teslin Council, I would like to thank everyone. Tesliners and Yukoners are doing a great job, and we are seeing lots of examples of people doing the right thing and also stepping up to help others. Please keep it up.

We continue to implement the advice and direction of the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) and the Government of the Yukon as we move into the next phases of re-opening. We are also asking members of the public to pay close attention to the guidelines for social distancing and self-isolation and orders from the CMO.

You will see more travellers through the community as travel within the Yukon and Canada becomes more relaxed. There are also Americans transitioning from the lower 48 to Alaska and back. If you have questions about borders and enforcement or would like to report a possible infraction of the Civil Emergency Measures Act, please call 1-877-374-0425 or email covid19enforcement@gov.yk.ca.

If you need non-medical information and support about COVID-19, call 1-877-374-0425. The line is open seven days a week between 7:30 a.m. and 8 p.m. You can also email covid19info@gov.yk.ca.

Municipal Services

The Village of Teslin continues to focus on maintaining essential municipal services, which include water treatment, water delivery, sewer system, and garbage disposal. All services are back to normal, although recreation programming is greatly modified due to social distancing. Please checkout the Teslin Recreation Facebook page, the posters around town, or call the municipal office for more information about events. It is nice to get back to some level of activity.

All municipal employees are practicing social distancing in their daily work, so behind the scenes, there is a significant modification to work routines. Please be patient with our staff. The municipal office remains open with its standard hours. As part of social distancing measures, community members are encouraged to pay VOT bills by electronic transfer if possible. Our council meetings also continue but at the rec plex.

I want to extend a big thank you to the VOT staff who worked through this challenging time to deliver services to our community.

Property Taxes

Your tax bill has arrived, but to help ease the economic impact of COVID-19, the Government of Yukon and Yukon municipalities are giving Yukon residential and commercial property owners whose incomes are affected by COVID-19, the ability to pay their property taxes up to September 2 without penalty.

Property taxes are a significant source of revenue for Yukon municipalities, which provide essential services like water treatment, water delivery, sewer system, and garbage disposal for their residents. This step is designed to provide relief to those community members who need it most.

The mosquitos are bad this year! VOT did its usual annual mosquito control treatment of the community. Unfortunately, this is a nasty mosquito year, and Teslin is not alone as the entire Yukon is experiencing a bad season.



Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door


Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.



- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children.
 Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.
