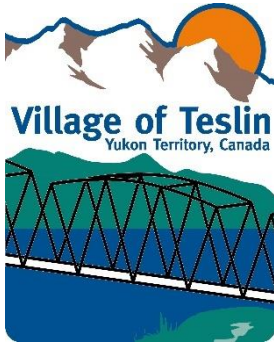

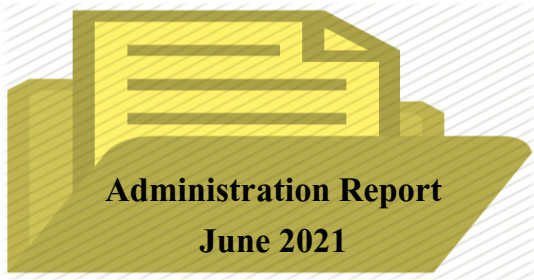

## **FLOOD**

The flood has kept us busy during the month of June. We have been working closely with TTC, and Emergency measures to protect properties and homes from flooding. Thank you to DDC and their crew of labourers for sandbagging. The bank in Smarchville and along the Alaska Highway is eroding so we are and will continue to haul and place riprap to stabilize the bank.

## **TESLIN ROADS**

We will be patching potholes and cleaning culverts in the coming weeks, please watch for crews working. Speed bumps have been installed. Additional speed bumps have been installed on the sawmill road.

## **SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING**

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday Closed to public

Wednesday–Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

Due to the increase in COVID cases in Yukon we are not accepting cash at the landfill, all fee's will be charged to municipal services accounts. If you do not have an account you can stop by the Village office to pay your fee's via debit or you can email transfer to [admin.teslin@teslin.ca](mailto:admin.teslin@teslin.ca)

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Due to the increase in COVID cases in Yukon the recycling center is not open for refundables.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

## **LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM**

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

Northern Enviro Services from Watson Lake plans a weekly trip to Teslin to provide septic pump-out services, please plan ahead and schedule your pump-out by contacting their office at 867-536-7361.

### **WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY**

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and accessible for the water truck and ensure the driver can safely access your fill spout.

We have received our new water license from the Yukon Water Board this will govern our drinking water wells and lagoon for the next 25 years.

### **DOG CONTROL**

**The animal control bylaw is available on our website [www.teslin.ca](http://www.teslin.ca)**

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

**Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.**

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

# June 2021 Recreation Report

*News and Highlights

Recreation Programmer*

June was a bit of a weird month with many programs needing to be postponed or cancelled.

We tried twice, but June just didn't work out for the Teslin Super Fun Slo Pitch tournament. We are currently looking to August to reschedule this event.

We also had to move the **Swim Camp** from the end of June to the week of July 19-23. Thanks to financial support from The Recreation and Parks Association of Yukon (RPAY) we are able to bring out certified lifeguard and instructor Willow Brewster to facilitate a unique program aimed at giving us the skills to safely enjoy the body of water where we live. The full week camp will run afternoons for ages 3-16. Our lifeguards will also lead a variety of special sessions throughout the week for all community members, including parents with tots, and those who want to learn basic lifesaving skills. See the poster for more information.

**Boreale Bike week**, originally scheduled for July 5-8 has also been moved to August 3-6. Guest instructors from Boreale Explorers will be here teaching a variety of bike related skills and going on rides around the community trails. Kid sessions run Tuesday to Friday from 10a-12p, teens from 1-3pm and we will have evening rides for adults on Tuesday and Wednesday at 6pm.

We did successfully launched our summer **Warriors of the Water** Canoe Program in June!! We have a great group of community members signed up for this weekly program aimed at giving us the skills to safely navigate the Nisutlin River as a group at the end of July. We are excited to have participants ranging in age from 0 (that's right, 0 (11 months)) to 67 years old signed up!! So awesome!!

Thanks to the Teslin Renewable Resource Council for the funding support of our **Paddle Leadership Course**, which took place on the Takini River from June 15-18. We originally had 10 participants ranging in age from 11-55 signed up, but due to the evolving COVID situation at the time, the group size dropped down to 3 youth and myself. The small group dynamic was amazing and the youth developed some pretty advanced skills in a short period of time. While our intention remains to include as many participants as possible in our programs, our focus on fostering skills and shared interests has really been realized on the last couple trips with smaller group sizes.

It was an amazing week and we are so grateful for the financial support to make it happen!!!

On another positive note we have a really strong Rec Team these days with Brandy Golebeski having taken on a full time roll with us as the Recreation Assistant (back in May) and 2 young guys joining us for the summer thanks to Canada Summer Jobs and YDAP funding. Welcome Jayden and Jed to the team!!!

We have a few other highlights to (hopefully) look forward to, in addition to Swim Camp and the River Trip, in July. The **Kiddo Camp Out** is tentatively scheduled for July 9-11. We are still watching water levels and the evolving COVID situation to determine where and how this will take place. Stay tuned. This is a camping trip for ages 4-9 that will focus on exploring nature, playing games and having some summer fun.

Young Explorers, Pickleball, and Youth Baseball will also continue to run most weeks of July. Watch the schedule for specific days.

We are planning a **Family Game Night** on June 16 at 6pm at the Rec Plex, and introducing the **Play in the Park** program to get the community out to enjoy different activities at Friendship Park on Wednesday evenings.

We know how difficult the last year has been on people and we know that the concern about community health is high right now because of the COVID outbreaks. We also believe that recreation plays a very important role in community health and wellness and will do our best to continue to offer as much as we can- safely according to the CMOH updates, safe 6 +1 guidelines, and new pre-program screening forms.

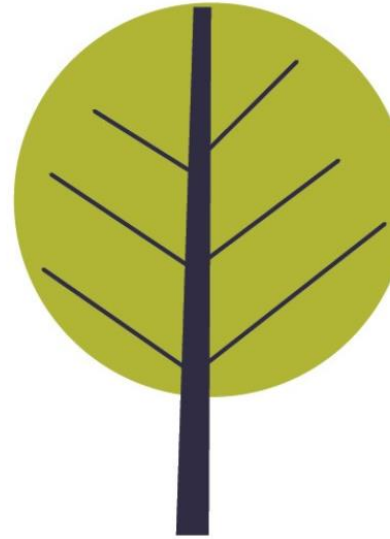



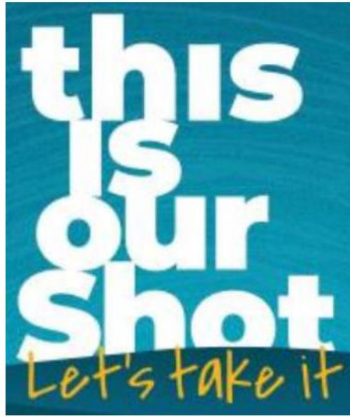

# Teslin Health Centre News

July 2021

## JULY IS SUMMER SAFETY MONTH

### Water Safety

- Supervision – watch children in and around water
- Protection – sun screen is a must to protect your skin from harmful UV rays
- Lifejackets – always wear a lifejacket when out on the lake
- Safe boating – always have safety equipment on board and don't overload your boat. Boating while impaired is also dangerous so please boat responsibly

### Cycling Safety

- Protect your head – always wear a helmet and make sure it's a good fit (2 fingers above your eyebrows, strap forms a V, and 1 finger space between strap and chin)
- Safe bike – make sure brakes work and tires are inflated. Make sure you can be seen and heard by drivers, riders, and pedestrian
- Know the rules – know the rules of the road. Always bike on the side of the road going in the same direction as traffic

### Sun Safety

- Be a shade seeker – on bright days seek shade from the sun
- Block it out – wear clothes that cover as much skin as possible and apply sunscreen SPF 30 or higher. Reapply multiple times or as directed on the bottle
- Be a clock watcher – the sun's rays are strongest at midday, limit time out between 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Be in the know – check environment Canada for daily UV index. When it reaches 3 or higher protect yourself!

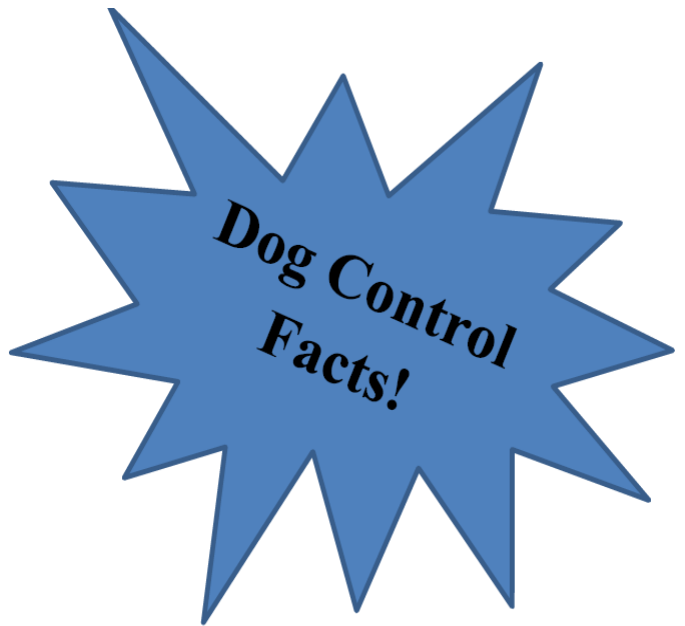

Applications are reviewed by a locally based committee and funding decisions are based on eligibility, merit and ability to meet fund criteria.



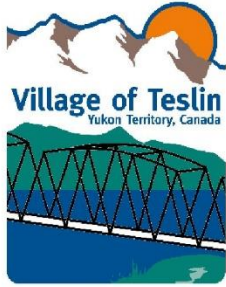
