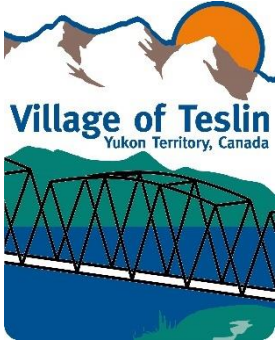

TESLIN ROADS

We are doing seasonal maintenance. Watch for persons and equipment working. Speed bumps will be installed as soon as sweeping and patching is complete.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday Closed to public

Wednesday–Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

As of May 1st all areas of our landfill were open, fees are being charged though no cash will be accepted. If you have a municipal service account your landfill tipping fees will be charged to your account. If you do not have an account a payment slip will be provided to you at the landfill then you can stop by the Village office to pay.

This is a great time to remind people you can purchase a landfill punch card for \$20.00 at the Village office.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

June 4th our recycling center will re-open for refundables though customers will have to sort and count their own recycling while the attendant observes.

June 10th we will begin the blue bin recycling pick up program, please ensure your bins are at the end of your driveway by 9 am.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

Our water licence is due in 2020 so work has begun on gathering information to apply for our new licence.

We have noticed higher use of water since many residents are spending more time at home, please be patient

As of June 1st, we will no longer be providing septic pump out services because Aaron Johnston has purchased a septic vacuum truck and will be offering this service to Teslin residents. Please contact Aaron at 334-3330 to arrange service and payment options.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

We have received numerous complaints about dogs running at large in the Fox Point subdivision we are actively pursuing loose dogs in the area.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

No doubt May was another weird month for Recreation as we continued to try and get around the restrictions of COVID- 19. We are excited to be slowly getting more programming back.

We had good participation for our virtual Fitness classes on Mondays and Wednesdays at 5:30pm. These classes will continue to be offered via Zoom as we also look to resume in-person classes in June.

We have had some fun with the kids who have participated in Breakdance classes (led by the Heart of Riverdale) on Tuesday afternoons and the Kids Yoga sessions (led by Paige Johnston) on Thursday mornings.

We had 25 people sign up for **The 4 Week Challenge**, which ran for the month of May. The 4 Week Challenge is a checklist of lifestyle guidelines that cover a broad spectrum of positive behaviours to reinforce good habits and act as daily reminders that the little things really do add up! Participants had the opportunity to submit their completed checklist at the end of each week to be entered into a draw for prizes funded by RPAY. (Thanks you RPAY!!) The grand prize of a \$500 Air North Gift Certificate will be drawn from all those who successfully completed all 4 weeks of the Challenge.

May 2020 Recreation Report

Kids Club will focus on outdoor games and activities such as nature walks, gardening and non-contact field games. Kids Club is registration based and taking place Wednesday afternoons from 3-4:30pm for ages 6-9. Softball Yukon has provided us with softball kits (through their 'Safe at Home' program) that include new gloves, practice equipment and a take-home drill book. We will award these kits to the first 8 youth aged 6-11 who sign up for the **Youth Softball program**. This will run on Mondays from 3-4pm.

Youth drop-in at the Rec Plex will resume for youth age 10-12 on Friday nights and ages 13+ on Saturday nights from 7-9pm. We can take in the first 9 youth who show up each night. Activities will be limited to those that allow for appropriate distancing such as movie nights and non-contact games.

We are looking for some Teens to help us do some clean up/brush clearing on recreational trails around town. We will try and hit the trails on a weekly basis but the times of **Teens on the Trails** may vary.

We will set up for **Outdoor Archery** at Friendship Park on Friday afternoons from 2:30-4:30pm and for outdoor **Pickleball** outside of the VOT office on Wednesdays at noon.

We were very much looking forward to starting our summer programming off with a Girls Canoe Camp and Boys Camping trip at the end of June. These trips are currently on hold until Yukon moves into phase 2 of the 'Path Forward' plan. Our fingers are crossed that we will be able to go ahead with our camps and will keep you posted.

We have not had much participation from the older youth though....so wondering where they are...what they are doing...and what programs they would be interested in???

Message from the Mayor

I would like to thank everyone who is doing their part as we deal with this unprecedented situation. Tesliners and Yukoners have been doing a great job and we are seeing lots of examples of people doing the right thing and also stepping up to help others.

We continue to monitor and implement the advice and direction of the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) and the Government of the Yukon as we move into next phases of re-opening. We are also asking members of the public to pay close attention to the guidelines for social distancing and self-isolation and orders from the CMO.

Intercommunity travel will start up again with the opening of campgrounds and general relaxing of measures. We are continuing to discuss balancing economic wellbeing and community public health with the Government of the Yukon.

Municipal Services

The Village of Teslin continues to focus on maintaining essential municipal services, which include water treatment, water delivery, sewer system, and garbage disposal. Garbage pickup continued as scheduled throughout the pandemic, and the solid waste transfer station (i.e. the dump) remained open although on more limited hours and services throughout the pandemic. On June 4th the recycling centre will re-open for all recycling including refundables. Please note that you will have to count your own refundables while the attendant watches and there is a limit of one customer at a time. Starting on June 10th, we go back to regular hours at the station and resume recycling pick up.

The municipal office remains open with its standard hours. As part of social distancing measures, community members are asked to consider paying VOT bills by electronic transfer if possible. Our council meetings will also continue, but at the rec plex. On May 19th, we had our first meeting with all council members present in person.

Recreation using Zoom and other interesting methods continued throughout the pandemic thanks to our innovative recreation coordinator, Lindsay Johnston. We are slowly moving towards our more traditional recreation programming with CMO approved measures in place. Checkout the Teslin Recreation Facebook page, the posters around town, or call the municipal office for more information about events. Its nice to get back to some level of activity.

I would like extend a big thank you to the VOT staff who worked through this challenging time to deliver services to our community.

Property Taxes

To help ease the economic impact of COVID-19, the Government of Yukon and Yukon municipalities are giving Yukon residential and commercial property owners whose incomes are affected by COVID-19, the ability to pay their property taxes up to September 2 without penalty. Taxes are usually due on July 2 of every year.

Property taxes are a significant source of revenue for Yukon municipalities, which provide essential services like water treatment, water delivery, sewer system, and garbage disposal for their residents. This step is designed to provide relief to those community members who need it most.

Hello Teslin! It has been a few months since we last met, so we thought we would provide you with a short update as to where we are at with the Nisutlin Bay Bridge project.

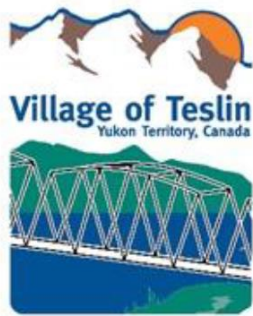

Steak Frites Burger

Directions

Ingredients

- 4 hamburger patties
 - kosher salt
 - Freshly ground black pepper
 - 4 slices cheddar
 - 4 Hamburger buns
 - French fries (fresh or frozen and cooked), for topping
 - 1/4 c. steak sauce
- Heat grill or grill pan to high. Season burger patties with salt and pepper and grill until pink, 6 minutes per side for medium. Add cheese and let melt, 1 minute.
 - Assemble burger: Add patty and French fries to bun bottom, then drizzle with steak sauce, cover with top bun and serve.



CRISPY MAPLE DOUGHNUTS

Ingredients

- ❑ 8 cinnamon doughnuts
- ❑ 80ml (1/3 cup) maple syrup
- ❑ 4 scoops honey and macadamia ice-cream
- ❑ 2 tbs walnuts, toasted, chopped

Directions

- ❑ Preheat a sandwich press. Brush the doughnuts with 1 tbs of the maple syrup. Place half the doughnuts in the sandwich press. Cook, turning occasionally, for 4-5 minutes or until heated through and caramelised. Keep warm. Repeat with the remaining doughnuts.
- ❑ Divide the warm caramelised doughnuts among serving plates. Top with a scoop of ice-cream and sprinkle with walnut. Drizzle with the remaining maple syrup.

All dogs must be licensed with the Village Of Teslin. There are two programs sponsored by YG & TTC/VOT to assist dog owners with the vet bill to have your dog spayed or neutered. Dogs running at large (off their property & not with the owner) will be picked up by the Village of Teslin. We only hold dogs in our pound for 3 business days after that the dog will be relocated or re-homed.

Pound Fees

Licensed Dog – First offense \$75.00

Unlicensed Dog- First offense \$100.00 plus the purchase of a license \$80.00

Not spayed or neutered - \$80.00

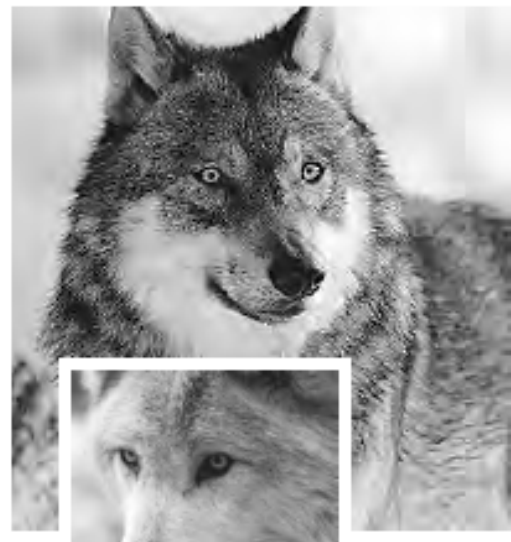

Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door



Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.

- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time.
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children. Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.

Applications are reviewed by a locally based committee and funding decisions are based on eligibility, merit and ability to meet fund criteria.



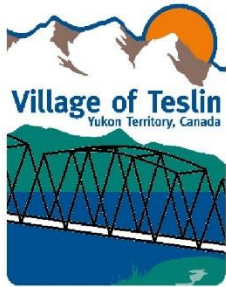
