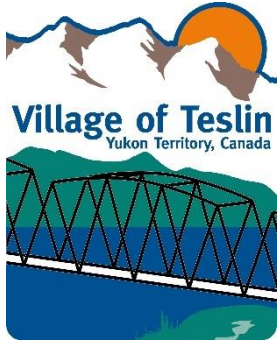

TESLIN ROADS

Roads are in summer driving conditions. Speed bumps have been installed. We have heard there are mixed reviews about the speed bumps, so we would like to hear from you on traffic control measures and ideas.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday Closed to public

Wednesday–Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

Make sure you stop and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Recycling center is open to the public, though people are asked to count their own recycling.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies. Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and **accessible for the water truck** and the path to your fill spout is clear of snow, dog feces and obstacles.

With the increasing demand for water delivery schedules may changed from time to time.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we are now patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

If you need materials to secure your dog on your property let us know and we can provide it to you.

If your female dog is in heat please keep them secure in your yard or home to help avoid dogs packing in groups.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog, please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

May 2022 Recreation Report

We are headed to the Takini River Campground from June 5- 8, for a **Paddle Leadership Course** with paddle Canada sanctioned instructor Jane Vincent. This course focuses on everything from basic paddle skills and river rescues, to more technical skills like eddy turns and navigating white-water along various sections of the Takini River. It is a great course intended for mature participants of all ages. This trip is part of our **Warriors of the Water (WOW) Canoe program**. This program will run in Teslin on Thursday evenings from 5:30-7:30p throughout the summer and be the precursor for our annual **Nisutlin River Trip** tentatively scheduled for the first week of August. WOW aims to get people comfortable to safely navigate bodies of water in canoe. It is a fun program for all ages and helps the group get to know each other before heading out on a multi day canoe trip from Portage (south Canol road) to Teslin. You do not have to go on the Nisutlin River trip to participate in the WOW program, but you do have to participate in WOW if you want to go on the river trip. Sign up is required prior to getting on the water with us.

Archery has been seeing more and more participants of all ages on a weekly basis. We plan to move this Tuesday evening (5:30-6:30p) program outside in June, so stay tuned and come shoot with us in Friendship Park this summer. Thanks to the Yukon Aboriginal Sport Circle (YASC) and Sport for Social Development in Indigenous Communities (SSDIC) funding, we have acquired several new (and big) archery targets. These targets are destined for an outdoor archery course (rec trail loop) we are working on behind the ball diamond. We hope to have this course designed and in use later in the summer.

May 2022 Recreation Report

Our community trail project is continuing along and we have received all the signage for several of the popular trails that will comprise the Teslin trail system. This will help users plan routes of various distances and difficulties more easily and navigate them more safely. The trail system will identify both motorized and non-motorized options, respect cultural significance of trails and areas, and include interpretive signage. You can join us to explore some of these trails as part of the **Jed Hikes** program starting in July. Rec assistant Jed Sharp will also coordinate hikes that explore other areas just outside of Teslin, such as at 12 mile, the upper backside of the Microwave Tower, and Morley Gorge this summer. Jed Hikes will be Saturdays with car pool meeting at the rec plex parking lot @11am for these day hikes. There will also be some teaming up with Wilfred to prepare for some larger potential hikes later in Summer.

We will hit the road to Whitehorse on July 6 for our annual **Paintball** trip. We will cover transport, pizza, and entrance fees and participants are responsible for purchasing their own paintballs. Minimum age is 12, there are limited spots, and advance sign up is required.

Our **Mature Golfer 9 & Dine** is returning this summer. While we don't define an age of what 'mature' is, it is intended that participants be interested and able to walk the course and play the game respectfully. We cover transportation and lunch and you cover your green fees. First trip will be June 17 meeting at 9:30a at the VOT office and advance sign up is required.

We have lined up some great youth camps for the summer! Many will recognize these from pre-covid years such as **Circus Camp**, which will take place June 23 & 24 for youth aged 6-10 (may 12 participants), and the **Elephant Thoughts Science Camp** taking place July 18-22 for youth 6-12 years old. Elephant Thoughts Camp can accommodate up to 25 kids and will include lunches and hoodies for all participants thanks to the kind sponsorship from the Electricity Human Resources Council. Yukon University will also be coming out July 11-14 to deliver a **Biking & Baking Camp**.

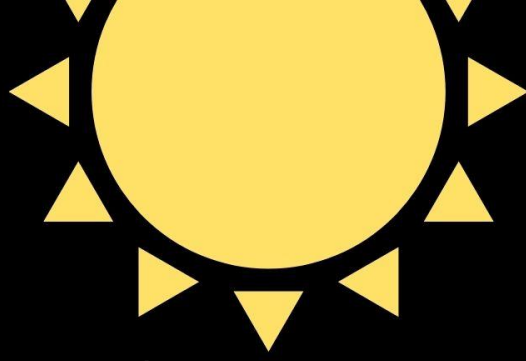
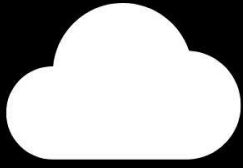

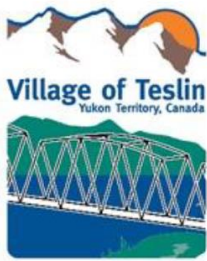

Changes to Handling Dogs Caught at Large in Teslin



Dogs running at large have been a constant dilemma for the community of Teslin. Increasing concern surrounding the potential of dogs packing up and posing potential risks to the public and other pets is growing. Yukon has been a victim of several dogs' at large accidents and incidents that may have been avoided if more care were taken to control dogs at large. Please be aware of the dangers that your dog can pose to others if it is allowed to roam at large in the community.

There are two programs sponsored by Yukon Government, Teslin Tlingit Council, and VOT to assist dog owners with the vet bill to have your dog spayed or neutered.

Dogs running at large (off their property and not with the owner) will be picked up by the Village of Teslin.

All dogs must be licensed with the Village of Teslin.



Pound Fees

1st Offense:

- Licensed Dog - \$75.00
- Unlicensed Dog - \$75.00 plus the purchase of a license \$80.00
- Chain will be provided to owner for containment.

2nd Offense:

- Dog will be taken to the animal shelter in Whitehorse to be re-homed.
