Message from The Mayor

June 2023

Here is an update on matters the Village of Teslin Council has discussed over the past few months.

If you are wondering about flooding and a repeat of last year's event, the snowpack was closer to normal, although a little higher than normal in April only. However, none of it is anywhere near last year's record-breaking amounts. That means we are unlikely to have a repeat of last year's flooding. The lake will rise closer to the annual average this year. We will continue with our permanent flood mitigation efforts in the coming weeks, including building a permanent berm on the lakeside of Jackson Avenue. Last year's rising waters threatened several properties along the street, and a lift station, which, if damaged or rendered out of service, would result in all residents on the south side of the community from the Village to the bridge losing access to sewage services. We continue to seek funding for the rest of our Flood Mitigation Plan, which includes berms and dykes in other areas around town to protect the entire community.

Seeing everyone at the annual community steak dinner on May 18th was great. After a three-year hiatus due to the pandemic, the dinner was a terrific opportunity to celebrate the community's efforts to work together and inform the community about TTC and VOT's upcoming projects. The Joint Community Development Plan remains the only joint plan between a municipality and a self-governing First Nation in the Yukon and is the standard for other small communities in the territory. Naa Shaáde Háni Eric Morris, Recreation Manager Lindsay Johnston recently had the opportunity to sit on a panel at the Association of Yukon Communities Conference in Watson Lake to discuss working together and our joint recreation agreement. Other municipalities were very interested in the discussion and relationship. Many thanks to all who organized the day – it takes a lot of people and commitment to organize an event like that. I am looking forward to next year's event.

The new playground in the Sawmill Subdivision is now complete. The Girl's Club organized the grand opening on May 25th. Rather than have the mayor, or some other stuffy dignitary cut the ribbon, the kids ran through the ribbon with great excitement before proceeding to scramble all over the new equipment. I could not think of a better way to open up the park. Many thanks to the Yukon Government Community Development Fund for funding the project, Play North for building it, and Cole Hunking, our foreman, for conceptualizing and project managing it.

The playground also has a new name. The Grades 4, 5, and 6 students from Khàtinash Community School submitted a long list of great names for the VOT council to consider. We chose three names – Bull Moose Park, Bearclaw Park, and Pine Needle Park – to go to the community steak dinner to be voted on by the community. Pine Needle Park was the overwhelming favourite—many thanks to the Grades 4, 5, and 6 students and everyone who voted.

As with every newsletter, I greatly thank our staff, who work tirelessly to deliver services daily. Without their dedication, our community would not have the level of services it enjoys.

The **Girls Club** helped plan the **Grand Opening of the New Park** on May 25th and we had about 30 community members come out to check it out and hear Mayor Curran announce the name. Based on public input and vote, the new park on Sawmill Drive will be now called **Pine Needle Park**.

Our youth led **Rookie League** baseball program has been going great with a lot of positive skill development happening. We will have a **Parent Game** on May 29 to get the Teslin Sabertooths ready for the big **Rookie League Tournament** in Whitehorse on June 3, where they will play against other youth led teams from several Whitehorse schools.

Caleb and Jed Sharp completed the facilitator training course for HopOn, a games-based bike safety program. They will be incorporating the training and activities in to Fridays Bike Club. Thank you to the Cycling Association of Yukon for getting the guys trained!

Our arena is all set up for a variety of sports and will be open on Mondays and Fridays for **Badminton** at 6:30pm, Wednesdays for **Pickleball** at 6p and Saturday Nights **open arena** at 7pm.

Our **Warriors of the Water** Canoe program is back again this summer. We will kick off with a trip planning session on Wednesday, May 31 @ 5:30pm and then regular practices will start up Mondays @ 5:30p. We are thinking we would like to tackle a **Teslin River Trip** at the end of June and a **Rose River Trip** in August. The weekly program is a prerequisite for going on the river trips.

Our **Mature Golf 9 & Dine** returns with our first trip of the season taking place June 7. We cover transportation and lunch, and participants cover their green fee. Please sign up in advance for limited spots.

Archery will move back out to the 3D target course on Tuesday nights. The course features 10 targets spread out along a 1km trail located behind the ball diamond. We are trying to designate this area as a non-motorized **Recreational Trail Hub** that can be used independently of rec programs as well. We are also in the process of having a 9-hole built in that area and will be adding **Disc Golf** to our Wednesday night activities. Thanks to funding from CPRA (Canadian Parks and Recreation Association) and the Government of Canada the course is being designed and roughed-in by *Yukon Disc* throughout the summer; and thanks to the **Rugged Apprentice Program** we will have a team of volunteers in Teslin in September to help finish it off. Disc Golf is a great game that the whole family can play. Contact us to find out more about these course and borrowing some equipment if need be ;)

There are many ways to enjoy the beautiful lake we live on and we want to make sure that everyone does so safely. **Swim Camp** is a program facilitated by certified lifeguard and instructor Willow Brewster to give us the skills to swim in the body of water where we live. The full week camp will run afternoons June 19-June 23 for ages 3-16. The afternoon of June 21 will be a fun swim day for Aboriginal Day at the Heritage Center. The rest of camp will take place at the Marina. Our lifeguards will also lead a variety of special sessions throughout the week for all community members, parents with tots, and those who want to learn basic first aid and lifesaving skills. See the poster for more information.

Also on the summer calendar again is **Circus Camp** July 4-6 and **STEM Camp** July 10-14 and the **TESLIN SPORTS CAMP** August 4-12.

Our vision for the **Teslin Sports Camp** is to get youth from every rural Yukon community and First Nation here for a never-seen-before opportunity. Our goal is 40 youth.

We have elite level coaches in the sports of Flag Football (Chilliwack giants), Soccer (Hope & Health), and Lacrosse (Fusion West Lacrosse) lined up to come take part in the first edition of the Teslin Sports Camp.

While we still have many details to work out, the basis is connecting Yukon youth through team sports they otherwise may not get exposure to.

Each sport will run for 3 days and be combined with good nutrition, positive coaching, role modeling and mentorship, evening activities and engaging experiences.

We are really trying to make it an all-hands-on-deck approach to hosting this amazing camp in Teslin and making it a super memorable experience for all involved. TESLIN, we need you!! 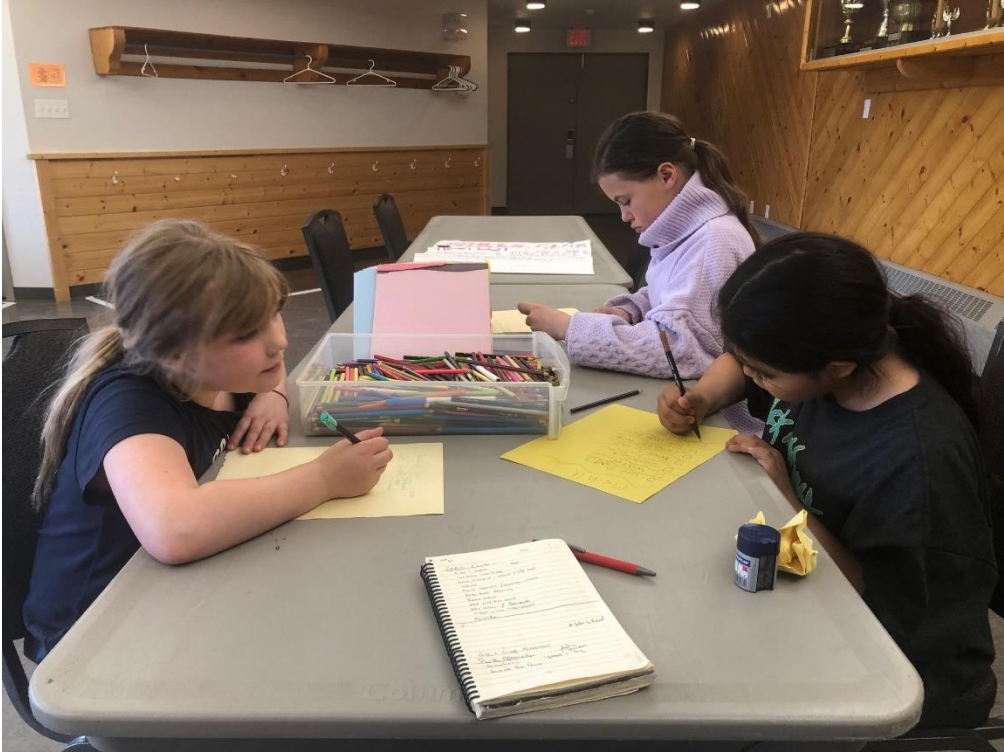

Banana Split Supreme

Ingredients

- 2 cups confectioners' sugar
- 1 cup evaporated milk
- 3/4 cup semisweet chocolate chips
- 3/4 cup butter, divided
- 24 Oreo cookies, crushed
- 3 to 4 medium-firm bananas, cut into 1/2-inch slices
- 2 quarts vanilla ice cream, softened and divided
- 1 can (20 ounces) of crushed pineapple, drained
- 1 jar (10 ounces) of maraschino cherries, drained and halved
- 3/4 cup chopped pecans
- Whipped topping, optional

Directions

1. In a large saucepan, combine sugar, milk, chocolate chips and 1/2 cup butter. Bring to a boil over medium heat; cook and stir for 8 minutes. Remove from the heat and cool completely.

2. Meanwhile, melt the remaining butter; toss with cookie crumbs. Press into a greased 13x9-in. pan. Freeze for 15 minutes. Arrange banana slices over crust; spread with 1 quart ice cream. Top with 1 cup chocolate sauce. Freeze for 1 hour. Refrigerate remaining chocolate sauce. Spread the remaining ice cream over dessert; top with pineapple, cherries and pecans. Cover and freeze overnight.

3. Remove from the freezer 10 minutes before serving. Reheat the chocolate sauce. Cut dessert into squares; if desired, serve with whipped topping and chocolate sauce.



Raspberry-Buttermilk Ice Pops

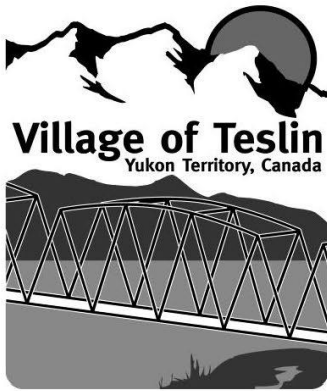
Ingredients

- **1 c.** fresh raspberries
- **3/4 c.** sour cream
- **1/4 c.** buttermilk
- **3 tbsp.** honey
- **1 tbsp.** fresh lemon juice
(about 1/3 large lemon)

Direction

- 1.** In a large bowl, smash raspberries with the back of a fork. Add remaining ingredients and stir to combine.
- 2.** Pour mixture into ice-pop molds and freeze for 30 minutes. Insert a wooden stick into each pop; then freeze for at least 2 more hours.





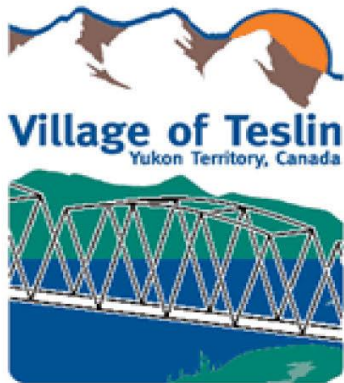
