

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

The free store has been upgraded; please ensure all items dropped off are clean and in good shape. It is not maintained by VOT staff, so please clean up after yourself. All items left out will be discarded.

Our annual inspection of the water treatment is scheduled for the end of February.

DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We have seen an increase in complaints about loose dogs wandering in Fox Point so we have increased out patrols in that area. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! 



MINT CHOCOLATE PUDDING

PREP. TIME: 15 mins
COOKING TIME: 5 mins

YIELDS: 4

INGREDIENTS

1/2 cup (125 mL) pitted dates
1/2 cup (125 mL) boiling hot water
2 cups (500 mL) milk
1/4 cup (60 mL) cocoa powder
3 tbsp (45 mL) cornstarch
1/6 tsp (0.5 mL) peppermint extract
1/6 tsp (0.5 mL) vanilla extract

8 fresh mint leafs

INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1

In a small bowl, stir together dates and boiling water. Let sit for 10 minutes. Pour into a food processor and blend until smooth.

STEP 2

In a large pot over medium-high heat, whisk together date paste, milk, cocoa powder, cornstarch, peppermint extract, and vanilla extract. Whisk continuously until pudding is lightly simmering and thickened, around 5 minutes. Remove from heat once desired thickness has been reached. Enjoy hot or place in the refrigerator to enjoy cold later. Garnish with mint leaves.

TIPS

If you like a bit more of a mint flavour in your desserts, add 1/4 tsp peppermint extract instead of 1/8 tsp.









ASIAN SESAME CHICKEN CHOPPED SALAD

YIELDS: 4

INGREDIENTS

1 lb (450 g) chicken breast

1 tbsp (15 mL) low sodium teriyaki sauce

1 1/2 cups (375 mL) plain yogurt

1 tbsp (15 mL) honey

1 tbsp (15 mL) peanut butter

1/2 tsp (2 mL) sesame oil

4 cups (1 L) cabbage coleslaw mix

1 cup (250 mL) steamed edamame

1 cup (250 mL) sliced cucumber

1 cup (250 mL) sliced red peppers

1 cup (250 mL) sliced mango

1/2 cup (125 mL) sliced green onions

1/4 cup (60 mL) toasted sesame

seeds

1 cup (250 mL) chow mein noodles

INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1

Preheat oven to 425°F (220°C). Toss chicken in teriyaki sauce and place on a parchment lined baking sheet. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes or until chicken is no longer pink inside. Then, cut the meat into slices.

STEP 2

Meanwhile, in a medium sized bowl, whisk together yogurt, honey, peanut butter, and sesame oil. Set aside for later use.

STEP 3

Place the cabbage coleslaw mix in a large bowl. Add edamame, cucumber, red pepper, mango, green onions, sesame seeds, chow mein noodles and chicken slices. Serve with the yogurt dressing.

TIPS

If you prefer a sweeter dressing, pulse ½ cup (125 mL) of mango in a food processor until smooth and mix into the yogurt dressing.









BRUSCHETTA Fish

RECIPE INFO

YEILD: 4 servings 1 serving = 1 fillet

INCREDIENTS

- 2 Tbsp canola oil (30 mL)
- 4 firm white fish fillets 4 oz (125 g) each
- 1/4 tsp pepper (1 mL)
- 2 cups chopped Roma tomatoes (500 mL)
- 1/2 cup crumbled feta (125 mL)
- 1/2 cup minced red onion (125 mL)
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 Tbsp balsamic vinegar (15 mL)
- 1 Tbsp canola oil (15 mL)
- 1/4 tsp salt (1 mL)
- 1/4 tsp pepper (1 mL)
- 1/2 cup fresh basil leaves chopped (125 mL)

INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1

Preheat oven to 400°F (200°C).

STEP 2

Pour 1 Tbsp (15 mL) canola oil in the bottom of a 9 x 13 inch (23 x 33 cm) baking dish and place fish fillets on top. Drizzle with remaining 1 Tbsp (15 mL) of canola oil and sprinkle with 1/4 tsp (1 mL) pepper.

STEP 3

In a medium bowl, combine tomatoes, feta, red onion, garlic, balsamic vinegar, canola oil, salt and pepper. Mix to evenly combine.

STEP 4

Top fillets evenly with tomato mixture and bake in the oven for 20 minutes, until fish is cooked through and flakes easily with a fork.

STEP 5

Sprinkle basil evenly over top before serving.









AVOCADO AND CRAB REMOULADE SANDWICH

INGREDIENTS

2 cups of your favourite guacamole recipe

Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door


Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.



- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children.
 Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.



Chainsaw Safety, Operation, & Maintenance Course

This introductory course provides students with the ability to demonstrate safe chainsaw use for bucking and limbing trees in the Yukon. Course work will also cover basic chainsaw maintenance, repair, equipment, and awareness of falling techniques, safety, and styles.

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Describe and identify safety equipment and wear appropriate for working with chainsaws
- List forest hazards such as snags, overhead branches, leaners and dead tops
- Describe a typical field emergency / evacuation plan
- Have an awareness of falling hazards and describe and demonstrate a safe work area for self and in relation to others
- Demonstrate proper liming and bucking sechniques
- Describe aspects of the theory of falling trees under 30cm DBH

Traffic Control Person (Yukon)

This two-day course provides participants with qualifications allowing them to become traffic control person (flagger) in the Yukon.

Field sessions give participants a change to practice basic traffic control skills and demonstrate competence. Field Sessions include setting up, controlling, and removing work zones in the following:



- Two-lane, two-way roadway with speed limit of 50km/h.
- An intersection.
- A work zone that uses only one (1) TCP.

Students will need to bring approved safety footwear with toe and ankle support, and all weather clothing for outdoor practical sessions. There is a written exam and practical skill evaluation exercise. Participants MUST receive 80% on the written exam and demonstrate 100% competency in order to pass this course.

Certificate is valid for three (3) years.
