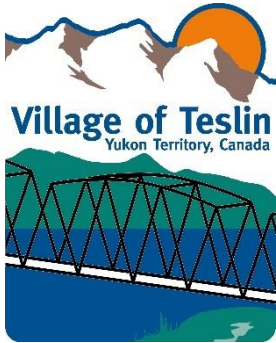

TESLIN ROADS

We have had above average amounts of snow this year so there could be limited visibility at intersections, please drive with caution. We are working on removing snow but in the meantime please be careful. We will be pushing snow and windrows back in the next few weeks.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday Closed to public

Wednesday–Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

The recycling center is open for refundables, though customers will have to sort and count their own recycling while the attendant observes.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements

February 2021 Recreation Report

Reminder there is **NO RECREATION PROGRAMMING MARCH 1-6 AS WE ARE ON OUR BISON HUNT.**

We started the **Cross-Country Ski Program** with much excitement from the kids. We see a tremendous amount of natural athleticism amongst the youth in Teslin and really want to help foster positive skill development and discipline through sport programs such as this. While we have been a little stricter with the kids, the push seems to be paying off and the immediate improvements have been great!

The Saturday **Youth in the Kitchen program** for kids 10 and up started up with good participation and success. The youth have enjoyed the first couple sessions- reaping the rewards of their culinary learning. We are requesting that youth sign up each week to participate

Yukon Aboriginal Sport Circle (YASC) with the support of the SSDIC funding was able to send out an instructor to lead youth **Boxing** on February 20th. While participation was down compared to our January Muay Thai sessions, we see great value to establishing a more consistent **Martial Arts** program in Teslin and will work with YASC to do so. We are looking into incorporating some adult sessions also.

We will be swapping the Tuesday Kids in the Kitchen Program for an **Arts & Craft Afternoon** for ages 6+ in March. This program will be registration-based running on Tuesdays from 3:15-5pm. We will limit this to the first 10 participants who sign up. The first session on March 9th will be a swan themed project led by Tara Easley as part of the Swan Haven art contest.

Boys club with Jordan has continued to have great participation with greater focus being given to personal quality time and building and maintaining positive relationships. This program runs on a drop-in basis Thursday Nights from 5:30-7:30pm.

We have been building up our capacity to run more land-based recreation programming and are excited to teaming up with TTC, some elders and CO's to take youth on a **Bison Hunt** at Kloo Lake, just past Haines Junction March 2-6. Part of this capacity building included Jordan and Lindsay both completing their Wilderness First Aid course, along with the purchase of a new wall tent and two woods stoves for recreation. We had pre-trip meetings with the youth and adult participants throughout the month in preparation for the hunting trip. We will spend 5 days out on the land with 4 nights in wall tents, and 3 days specifically designated for hunting. Our goal is for a successful hunt and the ability to invite community members to a meat processing workshop later in the month.

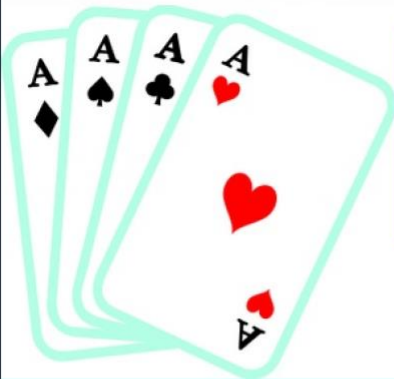
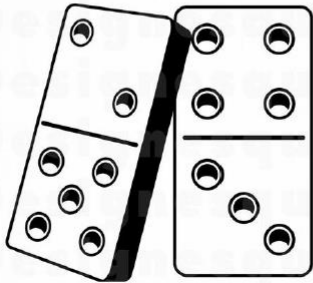

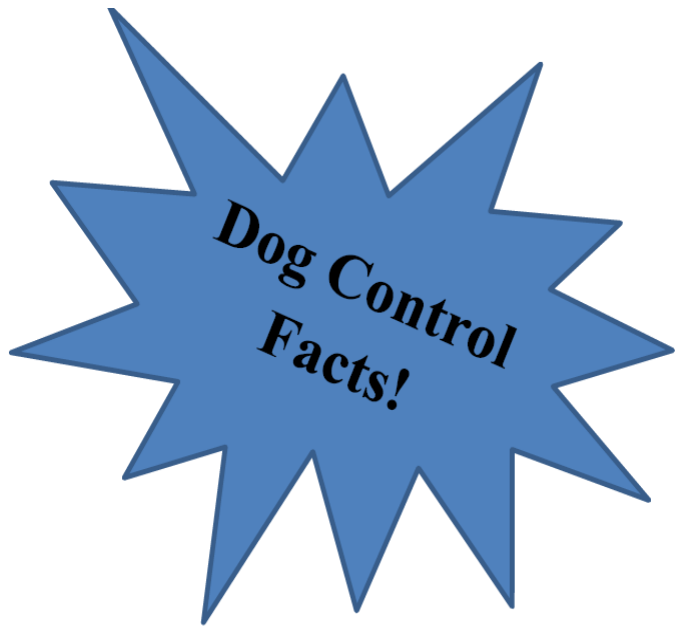

Applications are reviewed by a locally based committee and funding decisions are based on eligibility, merit and ability to meet fund criteria.



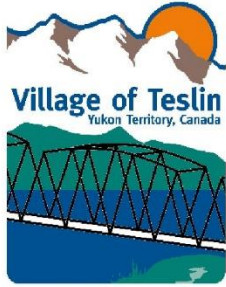
