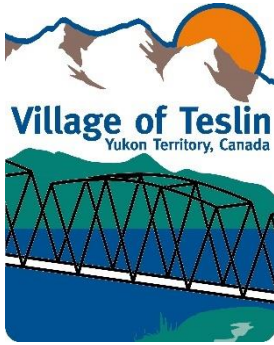

TESLIN ROADS

Roads are in winter driving conditions. Watch for equipment plowing snow. Please take your time and drive accordingly. As the weather warms we will be steaming culverts so watch crews working.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday Closed to public

Wednesday–Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

Make sure you stop and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Recycling center is open to the public, though people are asked to count their own recycling.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

TKO Services (Khiel Davies) is now providing pump-out services in Teslin please call 334-5636 to schedule your pump-out.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.

Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and **accessible for the water truck** and the path to your fill spout is clear of snow, dog feces and obstacles.

With the increasing demand for water delivery schedules may changed from time to time.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we are now patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog, please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

February 2022 Recreation Report

February in Teslin was so fun!!!

Sadly our efforts towards creating the Guinness Book of World Records Longest Skatable Ice Surface were thwarted by mother nature...buuuuuuuut the **Teslin Olympics** were the perfect way to get us outside and enjoying the beautiful February weather we had!!

We had 48 participants sign up to be assigned to a country team with others joining in or filling spots along the way. Team Norway, Netherlands, Sweden, Germany and USA sent delegates to compete in each of the Teslin Olympic Sporting events which included Biathlon (skiing and archery combined), Speed Skating, Bobsled (3 or 4 people on a plastic toboggan), Luge (solo toboggan), 3-on-3 Hockey, Snowshoe Races, Kicksled Races, and Figure Skating.

Athletes earned a point for their country by participating in an event and collected an additional 5 points for 1st place finish, 4 points for 2nd place, and 3 points for 3rd. It was a tight race after the first couple of events, but Germany took a commanding overall lead after the sliding disciplines. They maintained this lead until team Norway finally went ahead with points earned from the last event – figure skating. All members of team Norway took home Gold Medals and those from team Germany and team Sweden took home Silver and Bronze respectfully.

It was sooo much fun, and as a member of team Norway I deny any and all accusations of Russian Olympic Committee tactics in earning our Gold Medal victory!!!

Many have asked if we are doing this again next year.... And while I maintain that the Olympics only happen every 4 years and that's what makes them special... I think you will see other events like this in Teslin in the in-between years (World Cup circuit...? Olympic Qualifiers...?)

The Olympics ended with a crossover curling event and our **3rd Annual Teslin Lakespiel** saw snow, sun and super fun times!!

Tribute to Clara Jules

This tribute is a little overdue, but we thought we should take some time to acknowledge Clara Jules's retirement from the Village of Teslin Council. Clara decided not to run in this fall's municipal election, the first time in thirty years that Clara's name was not on the ballot. Clara's contributions extend beyond Teslin. During her time, she provided the vision and effort that created one of the most successful collaborations between a municipal and First Nation government in the Yukon that serves as a model for other communities.

Clara served ten terms on council, half as Mayor, which, based on our research, is probably the most terms of any municipal or elected official in the Yukon. Her municipal service started in 1991 when she became a councillor for VOT, followed by becoming Mayor in 2003 before reverting to a councillor in 2018 for her final term. Regardless of her position, Clara spoke passionately about issues affecting the community, and her impact extends well beyond her longevity.

Clara is one of the pioneers of First Nation/Municipal cooperation. Under her guidance, the Village of Teslin forged an excellent working relationship with Teslin Tlingit Council, one of the best examples of First Nation and Municipal cooperation in the territory, if not Canada. This relationship led to an award-winning joint community development plan and collaboration that continues today. It's no longer whether or not TTC and VOT will work together, but how. She also always felt that this community includes everyone and remarked several times about her desire to foster positive relations between First Nations and non-First Nations. Her favourite saying was, "We need to work together," articulating a high-level vision of reconciliation - well before that term was commonly used - in a way that was easy to grasp and feel inspired.

As a TTC Citizen, Clara was passionate about her heritage and history in Teslin, and her vision of municipal governance included all community members. She bridged the gap between the First Nations and non-First Nations and was very proud of the community and its members. When Clara spoke about the community, it was plainly from the heart without the "political-speak" that typifies political dialogue. As a municipal elected official, she cared about the people in her constituency and was never afraid to speak her mind when she felt that something negatively affected community members. She served her community well during her long stay on council.

As the longest-serving municipal politician in Teslin, Clara was also the keeper of corporate memory and village history for VOT. In addition to providing insight into past decision-making, she enlightened newer council members about some of the more colourful moments in Teslin's history. The Colourful Five Percent were apparently over-represented on the council on several occasions. Clara also reminded us frequently that we've come a long way since becoming a municipality.

We wish Clara well in her retirement. We know she will still be involved in the community and fostering the next generation of elected officials.
