Administrative Report

TESLIN ROADS

Winter is here! Please be cautious driving and walking as conditions can be slippery. Snow removal equipment will be out and about, so be aware and give equipment space to work safely. When removing snow from your yard or driveways please do not push the snow into the roadway or ditch.

If there are any concerns with the road conditions, please call the office.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday Closed to public Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm Saturday – 10:00 am to 5:00 pm

Make sure you stop and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no afterhours access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

The Village of Teslin ten-year solid waste management plan is now complete and is submitted to YESAB for approval.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All sewer lines are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the sewer system.

TKO Services (Khiel Davies) is now providing pump-out services in Teslin please call 334-5636 to schedule your pump-out.

The Village of Teslin will be providing a temporary pump-out service for the community and surrounding area. Please phone TKO first for all pump-out requests these as VOT is only providing these services as a last resort.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery.

Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and **accessible for the water truck** and the path to your fill spout is clear of snow, dog feces, and obstacles.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

With the increasing demand for water delivery, schedules may be changed from time to time.

Over the next few months Council will be reviewing the Water Bylaw and associated fees.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we are now patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

If you need materials to secure your dog on your property, let us know and we can provide it to you.

If your female dog is in heat, please keep them secure in your yard or home to help avoid dogs packing in groups.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog, please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

PROJECTS

The Fire department has moved into the new fire hall.

The tender for the energy upgrades to the municipal center has now closed and has been awarded and construction will start in the spring.

The equipment for the new playground in the Sawmill Road subdivision has arrived and installation will be completed in the spring.

FLOOD

TTC and the Village of Teslin are seeking funding to complete permanent flood measures and are in the planning stages. Community consultation on permanent measures will be ongoing.

OTHER

We are planning for future projects and we will be doing community consultation please respond as we really appreciate community feedback and your input is considered during decision making.

The Village of Teslin has received COVID-19 Rapid tests to distribute to residents, if you need a test, please call the office.

Please be considerate when shooting off fireworks, notify your neighbors or the Village office ahead of time. And set them off at reasonable hours.

Changes to Handling Dogs Caught at Large in Teslin

Dogs running at large have been a constant dilemma for the community of Teslin. Increasing concern surrounding the potential of dogs packing up and posing potential risks to the public and other pets is growing. Yukon has been a victim of several dogs' at large accidents and incidents that may have been avoided if more care were taken to control dogs at large. Please be aware of the dangers that your dog can pose to others if it is allowed to roam at large in the community.

There are two programs sponsored by Yukon Government, Teslin Tlingit Council, and VOT to assist dog owners with the vet bill to have your dog spayed or neutered.

Dogs running at large (off their property and not with the owner) will be picked up by the Village of Teslin.

All dogs must be licensed with the Village of Teslin.



* 1st Offense:

- Licensed Dog \$75.00
- Unlicensed Dog \$75.00 plus the purchase of a license \$80.00
- Chain will be provided to owner for containment.

2nd Offense:

 Dog will be taken to the animal shelter in Whitehorse to be re-homed.


Our current set of **After School Programs** have continued to have strong attendance and will run through March. Will work on some new spring programming to come out in April and that will run for the remainder of the school year.
