SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday– Closed to public Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

Beginning May1st we will open all areas of our landfill, fee's will be charged though no cash will be accepted. If you have a municipal service account your landfill tipping fees will be charged to your account. If you do not have an account a payment slip will be provided to you at the landfill then you can stop by the Village office to pay.

This is a great time to remind people you can purchase a landfill punch card for \$20.00 at the Village office.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.



The recycling center remains closed and the blue bin recycling pickup program is suspended until further notice.

There is a self-sort area at the recycling center if you would like to sort your own recycling. Refundable's can be self-sorted but no cash will be given.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

Our water licence is due in 2020 so work has begun on gathering information to apply for our new licence.

We have noticed higher use of water since many residents are spending more time at home, please be patient

Pump-out services are only available on Monday and Fridays, please call ahead to schedule the service.



WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

We have received numerous complaints about dogs running at large in the Fox Point subdivision we are actively pursuing loose dogs in the area.



Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements

Message from the Mayor

COVID-19 Update from the Mayor April 28, 2020

Before, I start I would like to thank everyone who is doing their part as we deal with this unprecedented situation. We are seeing lots of examples of people doing the right thing and also stepping up to help others.

In response to the COVID-19 situation, and on the advice and direction of the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) and the Government of the Yukon, we continue to take measures to curb the spread of the virus. We are also asking members of the public to pay close attention to the guidelines for social distancing and self-isolation and orders from the CMO. We do see most people following these measures.

Municipal Services

The Village of Teslin continues to focus on maintaining essential municipal services, which include water treatment, water delivery, sewer system, and garbage disposal. Garbage pickup continues as scheduled, and the solid waste transfer station (i.e. the dump) remains open. Sewer pump outs will only be available on Mondays and Fridays. All recycling pickup is suspended, but the self-serve recycling is open at the transfer station.

The municipal office remains open and maintains its standard hours. As part of social distancing measures, community members are asked to consider paying VOT bills by electronic transfer if possible. Our council meetings will also continue, but at the recplex with some members calling in.

We are working diligently to maintain these essential services while balancing community and staff safety. Please be respectful of our staff as they conduct their duties. We are monitoring the situation regularly, and it is evolving daily. The measures could change at any time based on new information.

I would like to thank the staff and council for working together on the measures.

Property Taxes

To help ease the economic impact of COVID-19, the Government of Yukon and Yukon municipalities are giving Yukon residential and commercial property owners whose incomes are affected by COVID-19, the ability to pay their property taxes up to September 2 without penalty. Taxes are usually due on July 2 of every year.

Property taxes are a significant source of revenue for Yukon municipalities, which provide essential services like water treatment, water delivery, sewer system, and garbage disposal for their residents. This step is designed to provide relief to those community members who need it most.

Social Distancing and Self-Isolation

One of the best ways to fight COVID-19 is through prevention through social distancing and self-isolation. <u>Monitoring your behaviour and those around you is very important</u>. There is lots of information available, but it is important to get facts from reliable sources. Below are some of the better sources of information for Canadians and Yukoners.

Please be supportive of other organizations and businesses in the community as they put their measures in place. Please pay close attention to the measures and work with your friends and family to ensure that they are following them. Most people in the community are supporting the measures, but assist those who need help understanding the seriousness of the situation. Do so with patience and kindness. Help us keep our small northern community safe.

The Chief Medical Officer advises against ALL non-essential travel between ALL communities. The chances are good that unless you live here or have essential business here or in another community, you should be staying put right where you are at. The Village office is also maintaining a list of volunteers who are interested in helping if you need help or want to assist.

Teslin - the community that works together

This is an extraordinary time of challenges and adjustments for everyone in the community. However, what is not unusual is this community working together. Whether it is our local businesses taking measures before they became recommendations, or community members calling neighbors, friends, elders and seniors, and family to check in on them to ensure they have everything they need. We are doing our best and have a resilient and strong community.

With the better weather, the lengthy disruption of our lives, or the lack of active cases, there may be a strong desire to let our guard down. However, relaxing our practices may cause us to get behind the curve. We are doing great, but we will get through this by patience, stamina, and mental support. Please be patient and demonstrate compassion with others who are doing their best to provide services, practice social distancing or self-isolation, or are feeling stressed. I know lots of Tesliners are quietly stepping up and helping their fellow community members. Please continue this practice, one that has existed in Teslin long before COVID-19.



Mothers Day Blueberry Waffles

Directions

- Preheat the waffle iron to the high heat setting.
- □ In a medium bowl, mix the allpurpose flour, whole wheat flour, baking powder, cinnamon, and kosher salt until thoroughly combined. In another bowl, whisk the egg. Then stir in the melted butter, milk, vanilla, and maple syrup. Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients and mix gently until just combined. Stir in the blueberries.
- Immediately, add the batter into the center of the waffle iron and let it spread it to within 1/2-inch of the sides, then cook according to the waffle iron's instructions. Remove the cooked waffles and place them on a baking sheet without stacking. Make the waffles to order, or place cooked waffles in a 300°F oven to keep warm. Serve with Quick Blueberry Sauce. (As a note, these blueberry waffles stick to the waffle iron a bit more than a standard waffle, so make sure to clean it afterwards.)
- Cooked waffles can be frozen; place them in a plastic bag and remove the remaining air with a straw before sealing. To reheat, remove from the freezer and lightly toast in a toaster.

Ingredients

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup whole wheat flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon Kosher Salt
- 1 large egg
- 4 tablespoons butter, melted (substitute coconut oil for dairy-free)
- 1 1/4 cups milk (substitute non-dairy milk for dairy-free)
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 tablespoons maple syrup
- 2/3 cup fresh or frozen blueberries



Ingredients

- ✓ 6 Tbsp (3/4 stick) unsalted butter
- ✓ 3 ¼ cups (20 oz) semisweet chocolate chips
- ✓ 3 extra-large eggs
- ✓ 1 cup sugar
- ✓ 1 Tbsp instant coffee granules
- ✓ ½ tsp pure vanilla extract
- ✓ ½ cup all-purpose flour
- ✓ ¼ tsp baking powder
- ✓ ¼ tsp kosher salt
- ✓ 1 cup (4 oz) walnuts, chopped
- 2 3 Tbsp heavy cream

BROWNIE TART

- ✓ Grease and flour a 9-inch tart pan with removable sides. Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- Melt the butter in a bowl set over simmering water. Add 2 cups of the chocolate chips, remove from the heat, and stir until the chocolate melts. Set aside to cool completely.
- \checkmark In the bowl of an electric mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, beat the eggs, sugar, coffee, and vanilla on medium-high speed until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Stir in the cooled chocolate. In a medium bowl, combine the flour, baking powder, salt, 1 cup of the chocolate chips, and the walnuts. Fold the flour mixture into the batter until just combined. Pour into the pan and bake for 35 to 40 minutes, until the center is puffed (the top may crack). The inside will still be very soft. Cool to room temperature before removing the sides of the tart pan.
- Melt the remaining 1/4 cup of chocolate chips with the heavy cream and drizzle on the tart.

All dogs must be licensed with the Village Of Teslin. There are two programs sponsored by YG & TTC/VOT to assist dog owners with the vet bill to have your dog spayed or neutered. Dogs running at large (off their property & not with the owner) will be picked up by the Village of Teslin. We only hold dogs in our pound for 3 business days after that the dog will be relocated or re-homed.

Unlicensed Dog- First offense \$100.00 plus the purchase of a license \$80.00

Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door


Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.



- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time.
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children. Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.


