Roads are in spring driving conditions. We will be teaming culverts and cleaning ditches so watch crews working.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Monday, Tuesday Closed to public Wednesday–Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

Make sure you stop and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Recycling center is open to the public, though people are asked to count their own recycling.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

TKO Services (Khiel Davies) is now providing pump-out services in Teslin please call 334-5636 to schedule your pump-out.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and **accessible for the water truck** and the path to your fill spout is clear of snow, dog feces and obstacles.

With the increasing demand for water delivery schedules may changed from time to time.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we are now patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

If your female dog is in heat please keep them secure in your yard or home to help avoid dogs packing in groups.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog, please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

Message from the Mayor May 2022

The signs of spring are finally here, including slightly warmer temperatures and melting snow – which is good and bad. Here is an update on matters the council has discussed over the past month.

Our council meetings continue to feature well-rounded and active discussions on issues facing the community. This council is very forward-minded and deals with the issues facing Teslin today while keeping an eye on the community's future beyond this term. You can only do so much in a three-year term, and we will deliver on several initiatives and projects this term. However, we are also responsible for setting in motion projects and initiatives that future councils will carry through. Many of our larger projects take several years of effort, from concept to planning to delivery. While much of this vision is captured in our 10-year Joint Community Development Plan with Teslin Tlingit Council, it is integrated into almost every decision we make, large or small. We want to set future councils up for success. For example, we recently discussed the future growth of Teslin and lot development, an initiative we are actively working on with TTC and YG. We may not see lot development during this term, but we need to do the upfront planning before securing funding and proceeding to development. This takes several years. Of course, an increase in houses means a demand for more services, and we need to plan for that.

As I said in my last report, the council and administration are concerned about potential flooding as we move into the spring melt. Our administration has been anticipating spring flooding for a while and developed a Flood Mitigation Plan over the winter, including long-term solutions such as berms and shore erosion mitigations. We have been working with TTC Lands to secure funding from the territorial and federal governments to fund the plan. Discussions are continuing, and we hope they will conclude soon so we can start work. YG has assured us that emergency funding will be available in the event of flooding (or when?), and our public works know what needs to be done. Property owners should also be preparing. Cole Hunking is always available as a resource.

Loose dogs were discussed at length at our last joint meeting with TTC. This is a reminder that dog owners are responsible for keeping their dogs on their property, whether by a fence, leash, or electronic collar. This is for the safety of your dog and other community members. For many years, TTC and VOT have also offered a subsidy to spay or neuter your pets. Please get in touch with the office to learn more about the program. We encourage you to take advantage of it.

TTC and VOT councils will be meeting with the Minister of Health and Social Services in early May to discuss the *Putting People First* and *Aging in Place* initiatives. *Putting People First* is about changing how health care is delivered in the Yukon. *Aging in Place* is about elders and seniors care in the Yukon. Both TTC and ourselves are very curious about how these initiatives impact services in Teslin. COVID is still with us, but this phase emphasizes strong individual awareness of your behaviour and the wishes of others. Be aware of your own health and the spaces you are in. We ask that you remain respectful of other community members, and above all, be careful, respectful, and kind to one another.

As our new fire hall approaches completion in October 2022, a tender seeking Tlingit artists to guide the work of designing and installing artwork on the exterior will be released shortly. Council wanted to ensure that the building was not just another municipal building, and as part of that, we are installing artwork on the exterior.

As with every newsletter, I extend a big thanks to our staff, who work tirelessly behind the scenes to diligently deliver services day in and day out. We can make all the decisions we want as a council, but it means nothing without a dedicated team that works daily to make this community a better place to live.

We are continuing to try and build meaningful programs that help youth develop skills and interests in a range of recreational pursuits. To do so, we put effort in to planning program sessions and have asked parents to help us out (so we can plan accordingly) by:

- Ensuring your child is signed up prior to sending them to a program

- Giving us a heads up when you know your child will not be at a program

- Making sure your child is actually interested in the activity
- Letting us know about changing interests

S.T.E.M. Club is a program for those who like to learn, create, build and experiment, and it takes place on Thursday evenings. We have had so many kids coming out that we had to split in to 2 groups. Group 1 goes from 5:30-6:30 and Group 2 from 6:30-7:30pm. We will run the program until the end of the school year and could possibly accommodate a couple more participants.

We are also at capacity for **Youth in the Kitchen** and have split in to 2 groups for this program that teaches kids about the importance of healthy eating and how to prepare a range of recipes (and even some treats). Groups will alternate weeks Tuesdays after school.
