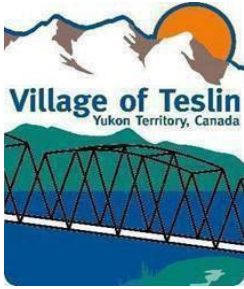

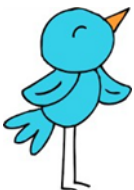

TESLIN ROADS

Please be cautious driving and walking as conditions can be slippery. Sweeping equipment will be out and about, so be aware and give equipment space to work safely.

If there are any concerns with the road conditions, please call the office.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday Closed to the public.

Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday – Noon to 5:30 pm

Saturday – 09:30 am to 4:30 pm

Make sure you stop and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after-hours access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9 am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to the Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

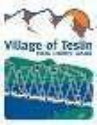
The Village of Teslin Solid Waste Facility operational hours are subject to change over the easter holiday this information will be posted around the community as well as on social media.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery.

Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and **accessible for the water truck** and that the path to your fill spout is clear of snow, dog feces, and obstacles.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems comply.

Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

With the increasing demand for water delivery, schedules may be changed from time to time.

The new water bylaw has been passed by Mayor and Council and will come into effect on March 1st. If you have any questions regarding the new bylaw, please reach out to our office.

DOG CONTROL

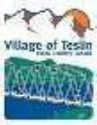
The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very seriously and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we continue patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

If you need materials to secure your dog on your property, let us know and we can provide them to you.

If your female dog is in heat, please keep them secure in your yard or home to help avoid dogs packing in groups.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

Congratulations to Jed on earning his Recreation North Certificate in Northern Recreation Leadership!! And thanks to funding from CPRA's Youth Employee Experience program Jed will be return to work with the VoT Rec Team during his semester break from Yukon University this summer. Way to go Jed!!!

Also thanks to some Yukon Government programs like the **Youth Investment Fund (YIF)** and **Youth Developmental Asset Program (YDAP)**, we are lining up to be able to bring on another young bunch of leaders to also join the team this summer. Go Team Rec!!!

Jed and Caleb will be heading to Whitehorse May 14 & 15 to participate in HopOn Training. **HopOn** is a games-based cycling program, run in partnership with Cycling Canada that teaches school-aged kids the joys of cycling safely. This program will be run as part of the Friday afternoon Teslin Bike Club through to the end of the school year.

The **Minor Hockey Wrap-Up** party will be on Monday, May 15. We ask that players who borrowed equipment have it cleaned and ready to be returned. We will also be eating pizza thanks to the RCMP and handing out this year's awards!! Join us at 5 pm at the Rec Plex.

We have been having a hard time at programs and as a result, have launched a **NEW PROGRAM FORMAT**. Our goal is to ensure fun, safe and skill-developing programs and we were not able to achieve that with the less-than-ideal attitudes that had been walking through the door lately. We want our focus to be building on our strengths and not constantly having to stray away from that to deal with poor behavior, bullying, and kids that are showing up for the wrong reasons.

In an attempt to build on strengths and try something new, we have now limited program registration to only the program of MOST INTEREST for the remainder of the school year. I hope this will make group sizes at programs more manageable and the experience of being at a program with others who also genuinely want to be there more enjoyable.

We hope this is just temporary and will start to acknowledge positive leadership and attitudes by awarding programs back to individuals on a weekly basis.



The single program choice excludes the **Rookie League Baseball Program** and new **Flag Football** program as these programs have additional coaching support. Youth did have to choose their top pick between **Bike Club, Young Explorers, Floor Hockey,** and the newly established **Girls Club** though. These programs all run in the after school time slot and we are looking forward to this sparking some positive change.

I would also like to note some exemplary leadership I HAVE been noticing amongst some of our Teslin Youth. Kingston Bottle-Wiseman stepped up in big ways while on the bison hunt to contribute to all facets of day to day camp life, along with being a great leader amongst the younger kids, ensuring that they were warm, engaged and having a good time. Way to go Kingston!!

Greg Sanderson was back in Teslin to run a **Youth Boxing Class** and **Women's Self Defence Class** on Thursday, April 13. We had 6 youth and 7 ladies participate.

The 4-Week Challenge ran through the month of April and we had 11 participants working on their daily habits and earning checkmarks for their efforts for all 4 weeks. Weekly draw winners received a \$50 Save On gift card or equal value gym membership. Congratulations to Rea Steiner, Shelley Hassard, and Kelly Howard for being the draw recipients for the first 3 weeks. The week 4 winner and grand prize winner of the \$500 Air North gift card has not been drawn at the time of writing.

We continue to keep the ball rolling on plans for the **Teslin Sports Camp** running August 4-12. We are calling for ALL HANDS ON DECK to help us host what we hope to be 40 youth from across the territory for 9 days. This will be to help with preparing meals, running evening programming, and generally being around to show support to these young people 😊 more details to come!

In addition to **Swim Camp** we also have lined up **Circus Camp** and **STEM Camp** for this summer. LET THE SUN SHINE!!!!





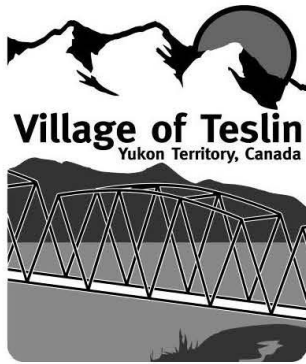
