

Message from the Mayor November 2023

Here is an update on matters the Village of Teslin Council has discussed over the past few months.

On Tuesday, October 24th, I had the pleasure of attending the first-ever Chiefs and Mayors Forum co-hosted by the Council of Yukon First Nations and the Association of Yukon Communities. We discussed our willingness to work together for the betterment of our communities, especially on complex issues. We heard from Na-Cho Nyäk Dun Chief Dawna Hope and Village of Mayo Mayor Trevor Ellis on some of their struggles with the opioid crisis, the desire for shared resources at the local level, and the need for increased supports in remote communities, including trauma-informed supports. The group decided to support Mayo's proposal, and CYFN and AYC will provide a joint letter of support. The opioid crisis impacts all communities, and it requires a collaborative effort by all orders of government. We intend to meet twice annually to discuss ways to work together and support our communities.

We are working on our budget for next year and continue looking at our service rates. Like everyone else, we have been hit with increasing costs across the board. We are trying to balance fiscal responsibility, service levels, and staff recruitment and retention while being sensitive that community members have seen increasing costs everywhere. It is an ongoing process.

Talking about staffing, we are currently shorthanded in just about every aspect of our operation, and as a result, our front office was closed on October 20th. I appreciate everyone's patience and understanding. We are working on getting up to full staffing and request your continued patience, especially with our staff who are currently carrying extra loads. We have an extremely dedicated and hard-working staff. Feel free to call me if you have any concerns or complaints.

Loose dogs continue to be an issue, and I wanted to take the opportunity to remind people to keep their dogs and pets contained in their yards. Remember that your Snoopy may be someone else's Cujo. According to our *Animal Control Bylaw*, animals cannot "run at large" off their owner's property. Your dog can be loose, but it must stay on your property. If you see a dog wandering loose, please call the Village of Teslin office at (867) 390-2530.

Finally, it is a great pleasure to congratulate our Recreation Director, Lindsay Johnston, who received the community recreation leadership award this year at the Recreation and Parks Association of Yukon annual gathering in October. She works exceptionally hard for the community, and seeing her recognized by her peers is outstanding. Make sure to congratulate her.

As with every newsletter, I greatly thank our staff, who work tirelessly to deliver services daily, especially recently with us being shorthanded. Without their dedication, our community would not have the level of services it enjoys.

TESLIN ROADS

As we are entering into winter, please be cautious walking and driving as it can make for very slippery conditions. Winter road maintenance equipment will be out working in the coming weeks. Please ensure you give all road maintenance equipment lots of space to work safely.

If there are any concerns with the road conditions, please call the office.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday are Closed to the public. Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday – Noon to 5:30 pm Saturday – 09:30 am to 4:30 pm

Make sure you stop and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after-hours access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9 a.m. Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins. There has been a change to some materials that can be recycled, information about what materials can be recycle will be available soon.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to the Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All sewer lines are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the sewer system.

We have been having issues in the sewer system with items being flushed that should not be. Please ensure that you only flush items meant for sewer systems. VOT will send out a poster to help people identify what can and can't be flushed.

TKO Services (Khiel Davies) is providing pump-out services in Teslin please call 334-5636 to schedule your pump-out.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

Please notify us if you will be away and do not require water delivery.

Kindly ensure that spouts and tank whistles are in good working order and that lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and accessible for the water truck and that the path to your fill spout is clean of dog feces, and obstacles.

The Village of Teslin is expecting delivery of our new water truck in mid-November.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems comply.

With the increasing demand for water delivery, schedules may be changed from time to time.

If you have any questions regarding the new bylaw, please reach out to our office.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very seriously and are actively pursuing loose dogs. Our public works staff patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we continue patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

If you need materials to secure your dog on your property, let us know and we can provide them to you.

If your female dog is in heat, please keep them secure in your yard or home to help avoid dogs packing in groups.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog, please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

TTC and the Village of Teslin are seeking funding to complete permanent flood measures and are in

Well that was October....

I (Lindsay) had some awesome trips out in October- first, to take park in RPAY's Annual Rec Gathering which was hosted in Carmacks Oct 3-5. Rec leaders from across the Territory get together each year to discuss, brainstorm and network as a means of staying connected, current and collaborative... Because we know how essential our sector is to the health and well being of Yukoners. It's always so great to catch up with everyone, meet some new faces, and realize we all deal with similar challenges and opportunities in our respective communities and organizations. We have a ton of fun and always come out feeling reenergized and full of ideas. It's awesome to represent Teslin at the gathering as well as my current roll of President of the RPAY board. An added bonus this year was winning the Government of Yukon Community Leader award ② Obvious credit owed to the whole Village of Teslin team who makes all we do in recreation a priority of our operations!

Second, I travelled to Ottawa as part of the Canadian Parks and Recreation Association board of directors. This was a neat experience because sandwiched between days of regular meetings we had an Advocacy Day on Parliament Hill. The board and some strategic partners were split in to smaller groups tasked with meeting serval MPs and Senators throughout the day to advocate for our Pre-Budget Submission. Along with merely asking for more collaboration with our sector to build a healthier Canada, some specific inclusions of the submission are \$4B/ year over 10 years to revitalize aging community recreation, parks, and trail systems; a \$7M/year for 5 year investment in wage subsidy programs and addressing aquatics labor shortages; \$3M to update the Framework for Recreation in Canada ... no small ask. But we know the importance of recreation as an essential service and the best preventative health strategy around, so we went for it. What jam packed days. Glad our evenings were filled with activities like a Senators game, pickleball, and lots of socializing!

What cool boards to be part of!!!

Speaking of which, the renewed Recreation Society Board has been crushing it!!!

They really stepped up and took the lead in bringing you this years' Halloween events, including the **Haunted House** (thanks to TTC for stepping up to pull of the **Family Dance too**), and the **Adult Halloween Dance.** What a successful weekend full of fun, costumes and GOOD TIMES!!!! Thanks to all the efforts made with the Haunted House Rooms from GRAHAM, the CO and the RCMP, and to all the bonus volunteers who helped out over the weekend. Way to go team!!

Next up for the Rec Society will be the **Seniors Christmas Dinner and Dance.** Date and details T.B.D. All are welcome at our meetings and there are plenty of ways to get involved with the Rec Society and these community events even if you don't want to officially join the board. Next meeting is Nov 6 @ 7pm in the Council Chamber.

The hockey season is here and we are super excited to announce a successful funding application to Crime Prevention Victim Services Trust Fund to bring in the **First Assist Program** in the new year. First Assist is an Indigenous Charity aimed at advancing educational outcomes in indigenous Communities through Sport. While much of the program design is still be worked out, our sport of choice is hockey and we believe we will draw great benefit from their instructors playing a role in our community over a 12-week period. They will be seen in the school, contributing to after school programs and running on ice sessions. To accommodate scheduling for this program **Minor Hockey** is moving to Tuesday and Thursdays from 5:45-7:15p and **Adult Hockey** will start at 7:45p. NEW THIS YEAR is a **Rec Hockey** group. If you aren't quite a minor hockey player, and not quite at the level (either for skill or interest reasons) than this is the ice time for you. We will start it running Sunday afternoons, but have some ice time flexibility based on the interested group.

We will be hosting our season kick off 4-on-4 Hockey Tournament will take place Nov 11 & 12.

Public Skating will remain Fridays from 4-6pm for now.

The **BIG 4-6 Sports** program will move back to Wednesdays from 4-5pm and focus on having fun learning and developing skills in a variety of sports through the fall. **Youth in the Kitchen** will resume on Thursdays after school with age groups of 6-8 and 9+ alternating weeks.

Our Local RCMP are great!! And Friday night Drop-In **Basketball** has been a hit. Sadly, our hire for the Rec Assistant / Facility Attendant position didn't work out, so we have that job posted again.



Chicken Marsala

INGREDIENTS

To make this delicious chicken marsala in a creamy mushroom sauce, you will need the following ingredients:

- chicken breasts boneless and skinless chicken breasts seasoned with salt and pepper.
- **all-purpose flour** for dredging (coating) the chicken to give it an extra crispy golden crust.
- Olive oil for searing the chicken.
- butter
- brown mushrooms
- all-purpose flour helps thicken up the sauce.
- Italian seasoning
- garlic
- dry marsala wine
- chicken broth
- heavy cream
- **fresh parsley** for garnish on top.
- **1.Prepare the chicken**. Slice each chicken breast carefully in half lengthwise (horizontally) and place one at a time, between 2 sheets of cling wrap or in a ziploc <u>freezer bag</u>. Carefully flatten the chicken breasts with a <u>rolling pin</u> until they are approximately ¼ inch thick. Don't pound the breasts too hard as it could tear apart the breast. Ideally, you want flattened chicken breasts to a uniform thickness. Season both sides of each chicken breast with salt and pepper. Prepare a shallow plate with flour and dip the chicken into the flour, evenly coating on both sides. Set aside.
- **2.Sear the chicken**. Heat oil in a <u>large skillet</u> over medium-high for 2 minutes until the hot oil sizzles. Sear the chicken for about 5 minutes per side until golden brown and fully cooked through. The internal temperature for the chicken should reach 165F. Transfer the chicken to a plate.
- **3.Make the creamy mushroom sauce**. In the same skillet, melt butter and sauté mushrooms until golden brown on both sides, about 5 minutes. Add a little more olive oil, if needed. Stir in flour, Italian seasoning and garlic and sauté until fragrant, about 1 minute. Pour in marsala wine, chicken broth, and cream and whisk well until the sauce is smooth and uniform. Reduce heat to medium and bring the sauce to a simmer until thickened to a desired consistency, about 4-5 minutes.
- **4.Assemble and serve**. Return the chicken to skillet and toss well to coat, allowing the chicken to cook and soak in the sauce for 1-2 minutes. Garnish with parsley and serve immediately with pasta, rice, or over mashed potatoes.



Pumpkin Chesecake Brownies

Ingredients

BROWNIE BATTER

- Cooking spray
- •1/2 c. (1 stick) unsalted butter
- •3 oz. chocolate (60% cacao), chopped
- •1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- •1/2 tsp. espresso powder
- •1/2 tsp. kosher salt
- •3/4 c. (150 g.) granulated sugar
- •1/4 c. (50 g.) packed light brown sugar
- •2 large eggs, room temperature
- •1/2 c. (60 g.) all-purpose flour
- •1/4 c. (20 g.) unsweetened cacao powder

PUMPKIN CHEESECAKE & ASSEMBLY

- •8 oz. cream cheese, room temperature
- •1 large egg
- •1/2 c. canned pumpkin puree
- •1/3 c. granulated sugar
- •1/4 c. all-pupose flour
- •1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- •1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- •1/2 tsp. kosher salt
- Unsweetened cocoa powder, for dusting (optional)

DIRECTIONS

BROWNIE BATTER

Step 1

Preheat oven to 350°. Grease an 8"x8" metal baking pan with cooking spray. Line pan with foil, leaving an overhang on 2 opposite sides. Grease foil with cooking spray.

Step 2

In a small pot over medium heat, melt butter. Remove from heat, add chocolate, and stir with a rubber spatula until melted and smooth. Stir in vanilla, espresso powder, and salt.

Step 3

In a large bowl, whisk granulated sugar and brown sugar. Whisk in the chocolate mixture until smooth. Add eggs, one at a time, whisking to blend after each addition, then continue to whisk until the batter is well combined, about 30 seconds more. Fold in flour and cocoa powder with a spatula just until combined.

PUMPKIN CHEESECAKE & ASSEMBLY

Step 1

In a large bowl, using a handheld mixer on medium-high speed, beat cream cheese until smooth, 2 to 3 minutes.

Step 2

Add egg, pumpkin puree, granulated sugar, flour, pumpkin pie spice, vanilla, and salt and continue to beat until well combined and smooth.

Step 3

Pour brownie batter into prepared pan. Using a spatula, spread in an even layer. Top brownie batter with pumpkin cheesecake batter and gently spread, making sure not to merge layers together.

Step 4

Bake brownies until set and a tester inserted into the center comes out with a few crumbs attached, 40 to 50 minutes. Let cool before slicing. Dust with cocoa powder (if using).




