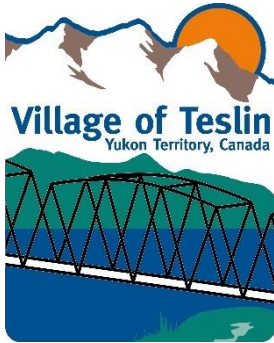

TESLIN ROADS

Fall has arrived be cautious of changing road conditions.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday Closed to public

Wednesday–Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

This is a great time to remind people you can purchase a landfill punch card for \$20.00 at the Village office.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

The recycling center is open for refundables, though customers will have to sort and count their own recycling while the attendant observes.

The blue bin recycling pick up program has resumed, please ensure your bins are at the end of your driveway by 9 am on Wednesdays.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

Our water licence is due in 2020 and we have submitted our licence renewal application and are waiting for the water boards response.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw had third and final reading by Council in August. If you would like a copy please call the Village office or visit www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements

September 2020 Recreation Report

With school back in session we aim to serve the need of parents to have coverage for their kids during the after-school time period. However, we wish to again remind you that our programs are not meant to simply serve as child care. The goal of our programs is to foster skill development, cultivate interests, and be a safe and positive environment for participants. As such, we have changed the structure a bit and ask that parents only sign up kids who are genuinely interested in the program and activity being offered. These are not simply drop-in programs.

We will maintain the following after-school programs, running from 3:30-5pm, in October.

Tuesdays **Kids in the Kitchen** – age 8+ - at the Rec Plex.
Wednesdays - **Kids Club** –age 6-9 - at the Rec-Plex
Wednesdays – **Girls Club** –age 9+ - at the Rec-Plex
Friday – **Archery** – open age – at the Rec Plex

Our **Community Art Program** running Wednesdays from 6:30-9:30pm has continued to see great turn outs and creative outputs. We continue to seek local artist to help deliver different art projects each week. This could include paintings, beading, carving and any other creative works. A longer painting workshop facilitated by Tara Easley was offered Sept 25 & 26, and we will look towards offering more of these sorts of sessions as we continue the Community Art Program through the fall and winter.

We ran a Salmon Jarring workshop September 11th & 12th. Rachel Blake shared her knowledge of cutting, preparing and jarring Salmon with the group of 10 people, whom all got to take home a case of jarred salmon at the end.

Facilitators from BYTE and Skills Yukon came to town on Sept 18 to run leadership activities with the youth. We had a good turn out, which is encouraging as we have continued to see some limited engagement from the teenage group here in Teslin.

Message from the Mayor

Update from the Mayor October 2020

As you all know, we are still in a pandemic, although the situation stabilized over the summer. On behalf of the Village of Teslin Council, I would like to thank everyone for doing their part as Tesliners and Yukoners are doing a great job. However, we are expecting a second wave to hit the Yukon in the coming months, something we are currently seeing in other places in Canada. So, please keep it up, and we can make that wave more of a ripple or less here in the Yukon. I know it isn't easy since we have been under the shadow of this situation for many months, and it is wearing on everyone. The best way to keep the virus away is by practicing the Safe Six:

- 1 - Maintain physical distancing – keep 2 metres (6 feet) between yourself and people who are not in your social bubble.
- 2 - Wash your hands frequently with soap and water or use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- 3 - Stay home if you're feeling sick.
- 4 - Follow gathering guidelines.
 - Remember to keep 2 metres (6 feet) between yourself and people who are not in your social bubble.
 - Indoor social gathering - Limit your group to 10 people if they are not part of your social bubble.
 - Outdoor social gathering - Limit your group to 50 people.
 - Organized indoor gathering - Limit the size of your group to 50 people.
 - Organized outdoor gathering - Limit the size of your group to 100 people.
- 5 - Limit travel to rural communities and be respectful when you're there.
- 6 - Self-isolate if you've:
 - Just returned to Yukon and have been outside of British Columbia, Nunavut or the Northwest Territories in the last 14 days; or
 - Been in contact with someone diagnosed with COVID-19.

Please pay close attention to the Safe Six and work with your friends and family to ensure that they are following them. Do so with patience and kindness. Help us keep our small northern community safe.

Municipal Services

The Village of Teslin continues to focus on maintaining essential municipal services, which include water treatment, water delivery, sewer system, and garbage disposal. All services are back to normal, although recreation programming is modified to meet the Safe Six. Please checkout the Teslin Recreation Facebook page, the posters around town, or call the municipal office for more information about events. Many thanks to our recreation staff for their hard work planning activities for our mental and physical health while keeping us safe.

Municipal employees are practicing social distancing in their daily work, so behind the scenes, there are modifications to work routines. Please be patient with our staff. The municipal office remains open with its standard hours. As part of social distancing measures, community members are encouraged to pay VOT bills by electronic transfer if possible. Our council meetings also continue but at the rec plex.

I want to extend a big thank you to the VOT staff who worked through this challenging time to deliver services to our community. Another big thank you to our community members for being patient with our staff and complying with the guidelines.

Governance update and other things

As we returned to a level of routine, we turned our attention to some delayed initiatives. We recently passed the third and final reading of our Zoning Bylaw and Official Community Plan (OCP) Bylaw after a significant delay due to COVID. This work started over a year ago with several public meetings, and we would like to thank the public for their interest and engagement in these meetings. Your input was an invaluable part of the update. Our OCP remains one of the model documents in the Yukon due to the participation of the public and our excellent working relationship with Teslin Tlingit Council. The plan can be found at www.teslin.ca/ocp-2020.

We have also passed a new Animal Control Bylaw, using public information collected during the OCP public process. It can be found at www.teslin.ca/bylaws. We also received a Trail Plan Report that we accepted. There is more work to come on the trail plan, which we think we take several years to fully implement. However, the plan gives us a terrific start, and some trails that are easier than others, so work will start soon, starting at our annual budgeting process where will identify which trails we want to tackle first. Many thanks to Jen Clark for her work on the public consultation and plan, which is available at the office. We are also beginning to revise our Business License bylaw, which is a couple of decades

old. A while back, VOT Council and Teslin Tlingit Council decided to add Tlingit to our stop signs. This project has taken a little longer than expected, but we hope they will be up soon.

We also recently decided to rename our annual school Citizenship award in honour of Bonar and Bess Cooley, who spent significant time supporting the education efforts of community members over their long years in the community. The award is now called the *Bonar and Bess Cooley Citizenship Award*. Renaming the award is fitting as Bonar and Bess were role models for citizenship and made significant contributions to the educational and cultural fabric of the community. Bonar received news of this decision before passing away and replied with gratitude.

This council and administration that likes to get things done, even in a pandemic. We've accomplished a lot in this term, and we still have a year left.

Teslin – the community that works together

This is an extraordinary time of challenges and adjustments for everyone in the community. However, what is not unusual is this community working together. We are doing our best and have a resilient and strong community.

I know lots of Tesliners are quietly stepping up and helping their fellow community members. Please continue this practice, one that has existed in Teslin long before COVID-19.

Many, many thanks to all who are doing their part.

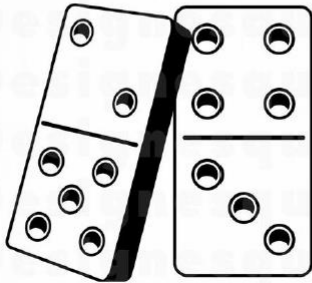

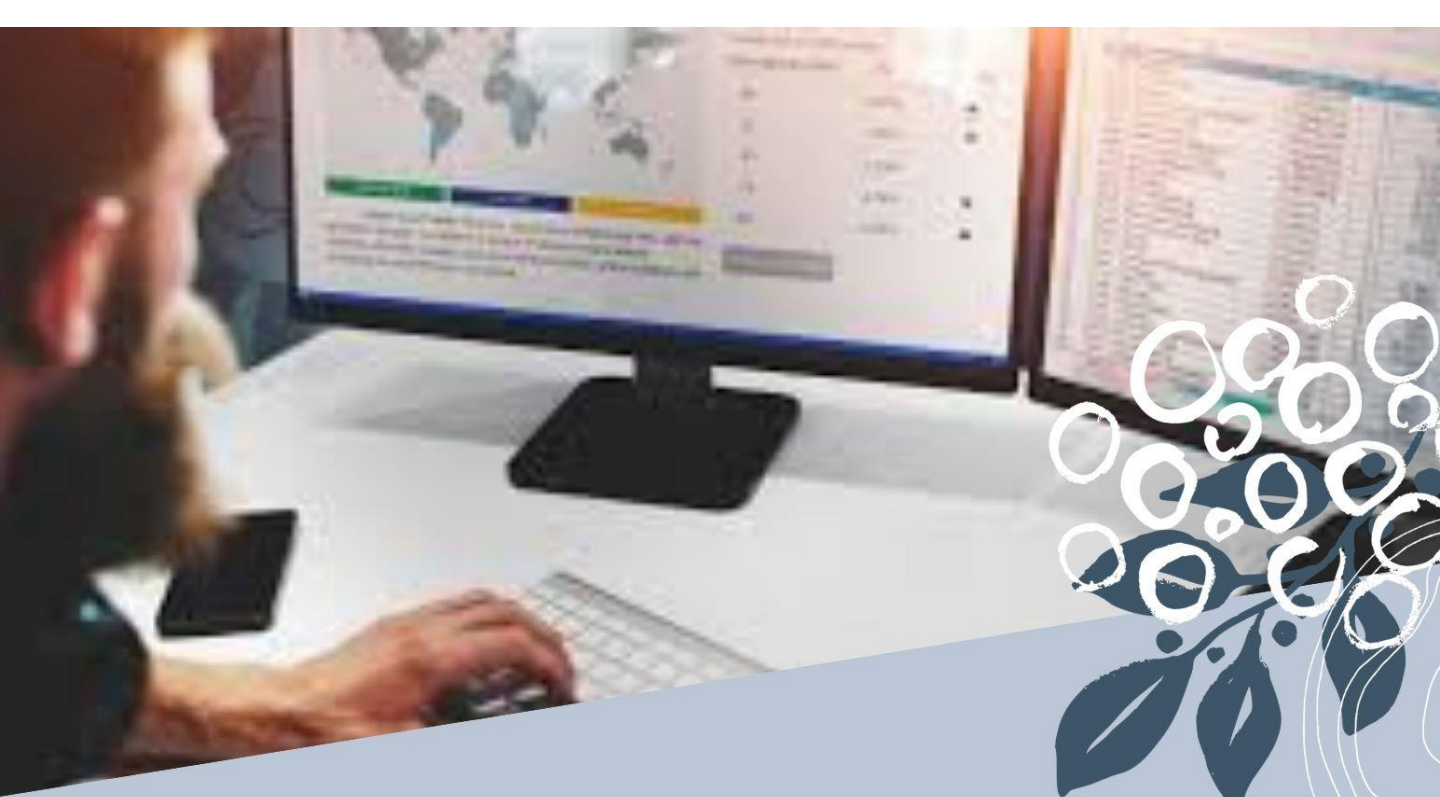

We have a new face on campus. Teresa Ward, who is familiar to many in Teslin, joined the campus in September as the Community Campus Liaison. She is with the campus part-time, and you will see her out and about in the community. Gord Curran remains as our longtime Instructor/Coordinator.

We just received news that we have funding to run an exciting new multi-week program in the new year. The Yukon First Nations Art Program will run from mid-January to early-April on Mondays through Thursdays from 9am to 4pm. The 12-week program is open to learners interested in developing their artistic skills in Indigenous visual arts. It includes six hands-on two-week modules, including beadwork, sewing, traditional footwork, and other Indigenous art. Each module is delivered sequentially to ensure students' learning experiences build on and further their artistic abilities. Students will be evaluated on their ability to produce high-quality products. The program will also include aspects of the business of art. We are also looking to hire local Teslin Tlingit instructors for the program.

Turning to the rest of our planning, not surprisingly, our 2020-21 planning was disrupted by the pandemic, causing our campus staff to scramble to reschedule courses and deal with COVID measures. Here is an update on some of the other courses:

Credit students

We have around eight students taking credit courses in Teslin from about four different programs, with four students attending courses regularly on campus.

Safety Courses

Standard First Aid - The campus has standard first aid courses scheduled for October and November, with another two potentially to be scheduled after Christmas, depending on the need. We can have no more than nine students.

WHMIS, Fall Arrest, Rigging/Hoisting, Transportation of Dangerous Goods, Traffic Control Person

– With the bridge construction project and several other infrastructure projects slated to start next summer, we will be delivering at least one round of these safety courses and possibly more, if needed. These courses will occur in the spring of 2021.

Chainsaw – We will be scheduling a chainsaw safety in the spring as per our regular rotation to update tickets.

Bobcat Safety – This course will be scheduled in the spring.

Food Safe – The campus is working on scheduling a distance offering of Food Safe with another community campus.

Contract Professional Workshops

The campus is coordinating several contract courses between TTC and YukonU Ayamdigut-based departments, including courses in leadership, supervisory, conflict resolution, investigation, and project management.

Public Workshops and Courses

The campus is also offering the following professional and general interest workshops to the public.

Excel 1 – This is scheduled to be delivered in November through a partnership with YukonU Continuing Education.

Bookkeeping – This course is tentative at this time. The campus is in discussion with YukonU Continuing Education about the possibility of delivering this training sometime this year.

Master Gardener – The campus plans to deliver this program in the spring in partnership with YukonU Continuing Education.

The Teslin Campus is staffed by Coordinator/Instructor, Gord Curran, and Community Campus Liasion, Teresa Ward. Check out and like our campus Facebook page <https://www.facebook.com/YukonUniversityTeslin>.

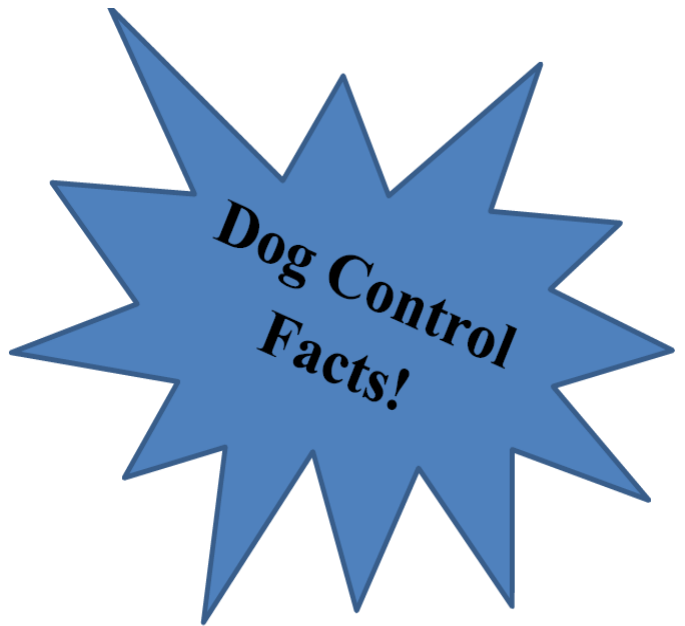

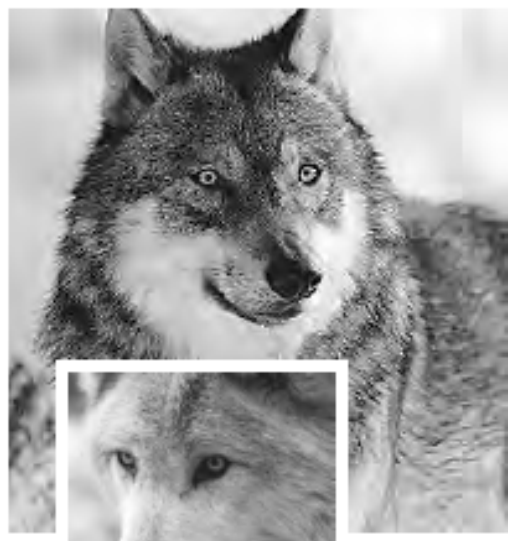

Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door



Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.

- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time.
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children. Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.

Applications are reviewed by a locally based committee and funding decisions are based on eligibility, merit and ability to meet fund criteria.



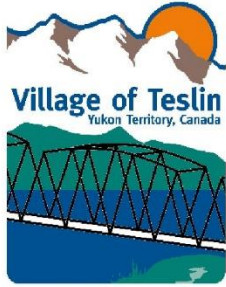
