





# **Administration Report September 2022**

# TESLIN ROADS

All roads are in fall driving condition. Please be cautious driving if there is an early snowfall.

# SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Monday, Tuesday Closed to public Wednesday—Thursday and Friday — Noon to 6:00pm Saturday — 10:00 am — 5:00 pm

# Make sure you stop and see the attendant before dumping.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

There will be construction at the landfill this fall to prepare the ground for scale installation, so expect some delays at the landfill.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

### LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

TKO Services (Khiel Davies) is now providing pump-out services in Teslin please call 334-5636 to schedule your pump-out.



# WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery.

One water truck needs repairs, so we are operating with only one truck, please be patient as delivery times may be irregular.

Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids are closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and accessible for the water truck and the path to your fill spout is clear of snow, dog feces and obstacles.

With the increasing demand for water delivery schedules may changed from time to time. Over the next few months Council will be reviewing the water bylaw and fees.

### DOG CONTROL

# The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week and we are now patrolling in the evenings. If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

If you need materials to secure your dog on your property let us know and we can provide it to you.

If your female dog is in heat please keep them secure in your yard or home to help avoid dogs packing in groups.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog, please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

# Message from the Mayor October 2022

As we enjoy the last bit of fall and prepare for winter, here is an update on matters the Council has discussed over the past few months.

Over the summer, our Council met once a month in June, July, and August instead of our normal twice a month. Although we met less frequently, our Council was no less engaged in community affairs as Deputy Mayor Juanita Kremer and councillors Trevor Sallis, Jeff Myke, and Luc Johnstone kept plugged into the community in a variety of ways. Our Council continues to demonstrate an interest in issues facing the community by actively engaging in well-rounded discussions. Our ability to reduce council meetings over the summer is also a testament to our outstanding staff, who ensure everything runs smoothly.

This past July, we completed the first phase of our permanent flood mitigation by building two earthen berms in Smarchville. Our staff project managed and started this work before the flood in June forced us to move to temporary measures. We are planning additional permanent mitigations in the spring, particularly along Jackson Ave., where this year's floods threatened one of our lift stations and the Seniors Complex. As usual, we are working collaboratively with Teslin Tlingit Council and will consult the public over the winter on these future developments.

Although the flood is well over, I wanted to commend our staff, who put in countless hours in June and July managing our flood response, and our local contractors, who stepped up and worked intensely over a very short period of time. As usual, TTC and VOT worked closely together for the betterment of our community, including committing our respective staff to efforts. There were ten flood events in the Yukon in June, and only Teslin managed theirs locally. The Yukon Government managed all others. Minister of Community Services Richard Mostyn visited Teslin in September and expressed his appreciation of Teslin's efforts since Emergency Measures had an active flood season. He cited Teslin as a role model for collaborative community response to emergencies.

Our new fire hall is almost complete, and the Teslin Volunteer Fire Department and local EMS will be doing a public event soon to commemorate its opening. Many thanks to the administration for a job well done. They worked closely with the project manager, Colliers Project Leaders, and the builder, ArCan, to ensure the building met expectations and came on budget and on time. Given the volatility of prices and the disruptions over the past two years, that is a significant accomplishment. We will be installing artwork on the outside sometime next spring, so it does not look like just another fire hall in the Yukon. We also had to keep up with our new neighbours, the George Johnston Museum.

Speaking of artwork, it would be nice to see more around town. As part of this, recreation brought in the Yukon First Nation Education Directorate to work with our youth to paint our recycling trailer, which sat in the Recreation parking lot in July and August before recently being moved back to the Solid Waste Transfer Station. While some of the artwork may cause pause for some of us of an older generation, it was a wonderful project for our youth who expressed themselves constructively and showed that they have all kinds of untapped potential. They also painted the wall on the skateboard park, which is definitely an improvement. Perhaps, a larger mural project involving the youth is in the future. It would be nice to see mural installations around the community.

We are also looking at reimaging our marina, which is showing its aging and needs enlargement. At a recent meeting, Council received a presentation from Colliers Project Leaders on a concept for a new marina. It will include a breakwater and a longer dock. A second phase after the Nisutlin Bay Bridge project is complete will consider more parking which is desperately needed. The project is still conceptual, and we will ask the public their opinion on a few things in the coming weeks.

As with every newsletter, I extend a big thanks to our staff, who diligently work tirelessly to deliver services day in and day out. We can make all the decisions we want as a council, but it means nothing without a dedicated team that works daily to make this community a better place to live.

However, this report also includes a sadder note because our Chief Administrative Officer, Shelley Hassard, is leaving the Village of Teslin to become the Executive Director of the Association of Yukon Communities. Shelley provides outstanding leadership for our administration and plays a crucial role in fostering a terrific team that makes our day-to-operations run smoothly. She does a significant amount of work quietly behind the scenes to improve our community. Council and our operations team will miss her greatly. While we are sad to see her leave VOT, we are glad she is staying in the municipal world and helping all Yukon communities in her new role with AYC. Her last day as CAO will be on October 14. Please stop by to wish her well.

# A Farewell to our CAO, Shelley Hassard

In September, our Chief Administrative Officer, Shelley Hassard, announced she was leaving the Village of Teslin to accept the position of Executive Director with the Association of Yukon Communities (AYC). We are going to miss her greatly. Shelley started working for VOT in 2012 when she was hired as Treasurer. In 2014, Council promoted her to Chief Administrative Officer following the retirement of Frank Thomas. Although initially hesitant to take on the responsibilities of CAO, Shelley gradually got comfortable with the role and quickly became a tremendous asset to the municipality. Never one to seek attention, Shelley always stayed in the background and made sure things ran smoothly. She worked diligently with her staff to improve their capacity and was committed to outstanding service delivery in a small community. She continuously sought ways to improve services while maintaining efficiencies and the financial viability of the municipality.

She also kept Council up-to-date on current and emerging issues and was responsive to Council requests. She consistently provided an excellent analysis of situations with thorough fact-checking and follow-through on issues affecting VOT. When issues came to Council, she always had well-thought-out options to present, allowing for a full discussion of the issue. Likewise, she always followed through on Council requests or brought back additional information for consideration. She worked diligently to prepare Council and give them time to consider major issues facing the community and municipality.

Every year brought more projects, many with our primary partner, Teslin Tlingit Council,

Every year brought more projects, many with our primary partner, Teslin Tlingit Council, with which Shelley maintained an excellent working relationship. Her leadership and attention to detail, especially around financial management and funder relationships, played a key role in the success of many projects VOT, alone or jointly with TTC, undertook during her time as CAO. These projects included roadworks, lift stations, fire hall, public works yard, trail development, and many other smaller projects. It is a significant list of projects for a community of Teslin's size with a small municipality. Teslin benefitted from her willingness to take on projects that improved the community.

There were other projects as well. Shelley also managed the revision of the Official Community Plan (OCP) and Zoning Bylaw, important documents that provide the roadmap for future community development. This major undertaking included substantial public consultation and was finalized during the pandemic. We also updated several bylaws over the years. Council could always count on a thorough evaluation of a bylaw's purpose and a lot of common sense in its revision and application. She also restarted the boundary expansion discussion with TTC, an important project for both VOT and TTC. Shelley also excelled during some tense situations. During the pandemic, VOT kept its doors open, maintained most of its municipal services, and continued work on various projects. She also led the community's Emergency Interagency Committee with regular calls with various Teslin organizations. Of course, she also played a key role in managing our flood responses over the past two years. Teslin remains the only community to manage its own flood response in the Yukon. This is a testament to Shelley's leadership. Her peers also respected Shelley, and she received the Employee of the Year Award from the AYC in 2018. She is the consummate professional and will be missed at VOT, although we look forward to continuing to work with her in her new role at AYC.

We wish her well. We know she will not be far.

We are hiring Youth Rec assistant for part time work this fall. JOIN OUR TEAM!!!



- · ½ Tsp salt · 1 Tsp pumpkin pie spice
- · 1 Tsp cinnamon · 1 cup canned pumpkir
- · 1 egg · 1 Tsp vanilla extract
- ·2 cups all-purpose flour

# **Icing Ingredients:**

- · ½ cup unsalted butter · 8oz cream cheese
- ·3 cups powdered sugar · 1 Tsp vanilla extract

# Instructions

# Make the cookies

- 1.Preheat oven to 350 F degrees. Cover a large cookie sheet with parchment paper and set aside.
- 2.In a large bowl, beat butter with an electric mixer on medium to high speed for 1 minute. Add sugar, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, and pumpkin pie spice and beat until well combined.
- 3.Add one egg and the vanilla then beat well, until yellow streaks are gone. Add the pumpkin pure and beat again until it's incorporated. Finally, add the flour and beat on medium speed until completely incorporated. Watch the video to see instructions on how to properly measure flour. The dough will be wet, this is what you want!
- 4.Use a heaping tablespoon or medium sized cookie scoop to drop the cookie dough balls a few inches apart on prepared cookie sheet. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes or until tops are set and no longer look wet. Allow to cool on cookie sheet for a few minutes then transfer to wire rack to cool completely before frosting.

# Cream Cheese Frosting

- 5.Beat together the softened butter and cream cheese in a large bowl until smooth and all of the lumps are gone.
- 6. Sift in the powdered sugar then add the vanilla. Beat until smooth and creamy about 2 minutes. Once cookies are cool, frost with cream cheese frosting.

# Easy treat for the kiddos: Pumpkin Rice Krispie Treats

# Ingredients:


- · 6 cups rice krispies cereal
- · 3 Tbsp salted butter
- · 10 oz mini marshmallows
- · orange gel food colouring
- ·non-stick cooking spray
- · pretzels
- · green icing or green air heads

# **Instructions**

- 1. Melt butter in a 4 quart non-stick saucepan or pot over medium-low heat.
- 2. Add marshmallows and stir and as they begin to melt. Add in the gel food coloring until desired color is achieved. Stir constantly until marshmallows have melted.
- 3. Remove from heat then immediately pour into bowl containing rice krispies cereal. Gently stir and fold with a spatula until cereal is evenly coated. Let mixture cool slightly (until it's cool enough to handle with your hands).
- 4. Spray hands with non-stick cooking spray, then shape rice krispie treat mixture into balls about the size of a baseball. Insert 1 piece of pretzel into the top center and reshape the pumpkin as needed. Transfer to a plate or dish sprayed lightly with cooking spray.
- 5. Either shape air head candy into leaf and vine design to add on pumpkin or create look with green icing.





## Changes to Handling Quantum Dogs Caught at Large in Teslin

Dogs running at large have been a constant dilemma for the community of Teslin. Increasing concern surrounding the potential of dogs packing up and posing potential risks to the public and other pets is growing. Yukon has been a victim of several dogs' at large accidents and incidents that may have been avoided if more care were taken to control dogs at large. Please be aware of the dangers that your dog can pose to others if it is allowed to roam at large in the community.

There are two programs sponsored by Yukon Government, Teslin Tlingit Council, and VOT to assist dog owners with the vet bill to have your dog spayed or neutered

Dogs running at large (off their property and not with the owner) will be picked up by the Village of Teslin.

All dogs must be licensed with the Village of Teslin.



#### \* 1st Offense:

- Licensed Dog \$75.00
- Unlicensed Dog \$75.00 plus the purchase of a license \$80.00
- Chain will be provided to owner for containment.

#### 2nd Offense:

 Dog will be taken to the animal shelter in Whitehorse to be re-homed.
