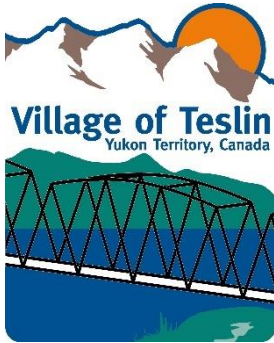

TESLIN ROADS

Some road maintenance items will be ongoing through the fall, in preparation for winter. and roads are still in summer driving conditions.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday Closed to public

Wednesday–Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

We are now accepting payment at the landfill.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Recycling center is open to the public, though people are asked to count their own recycling.

Recycling bins need to be at the end of your driveway by 9am Wednesday mornings for pickup. Please ensure there is no garbage in your recycling bins.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

TKO Services (Khiel Davies) is now providing pump-out services in Teslin please call 334-5636 to schedule your pump-out.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

Please note that severe winter weather conditions may affect our water delivery service.

Please ensure your driveways are clear and accessible for the water truck and ensure the driver can safely access your fill spout.

Due to the high water, YG Environmental Health is recommending that all water wells in the area be tested for bacteria. Sample bottles are available at the Village office.

DOG CONTROL

The animal control bylaw is available on our website www.teslin.ca

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements.

August 2021 Recreation Report

As promised, we will start off with a recap of our **Nisutlin River trip** that took place July 25-30, and what a great trip it was!! We had 14 participants ranging in age from 1 to 67 and everyone brought such great energy to the trip. We were rained on quite a bit for the first couple days, but then skies cleared up and we had beautiful evenings camping on the sandy beaches of this peaceful river. We paddled, we swam, and we SNACKED our way down the 137km stretch of river from the Portage put-in spot to the delta of Nisutlin Bay over 4 days. We were lucky to have a beautifully calm morning to tackle the remaining 8km of lake to get us back to the Teslin boat lunch by 11am Friday morning. Can't wait for next years' paddle program!!!

The postponed **Bike Camp** took place August 3-6 with facilitators from Boréale Explorers leading us through a week of skill development, riding the pump track and exploring the trails around town. The 10 youth who participated in the full week showed great improvements in all areas of their riding and grew way more confidence tackling trail hills. So fun! Super exciting to think that soon there will be a new system of trails around Teslin to explore. Thank you to the Youth Investment Fund (YIF) for supporting Bike Week!!!

Yukon University ran their **STEM Camp** (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) at the Rec Plex from August 9-12 with 12 kids taking part. The kids did science experiments, built robot cities, did coding and had a bunch of fun challenging their brains throughout the week.

We went to Whitehorse for another **Mature Golfer 9 and Dine** on Friday August 6, and had 10 youth participate in the **Paintball** trip on Wednesday August 18th. Families were invited to join us in the Rec Plex kitchen for **Bake My Day** from 6-8pm on August 9 and on Friday August 20 for another **Family Game Night**. We had reasonable turnout for these evenings and will continue to offer such events through the fall.

Thank you to our summer students Jed and Jay for all the hard work over their 10-week term. Both boys contributed lots of great ideas, exhibited a great deal of leadership and a desire to keep working with recreation. And thanks to funding from YDAP we have some money for keep them on this fall. It is our goal to find a place for anyone genuinely wishing to work in recreation and contribute to the delivery of programs that make Teslin a great place to live.

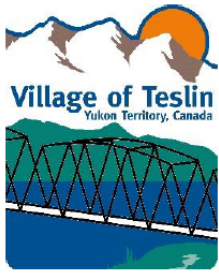

Message from the Mayor

Well, that was an interesting summer. I hope everyone enjoyed the best of the summer weather and navigated the ever-changing COVID situation. In my final post of this term, here is an update on activities by the council and within the community.

The pandemic continues to overshadow all of our activities as we move into a new phase. The Civil State of Emergency was lifted on August 25th, removing restrictions and enforcement. While many will embrace these changes, others in our community are anxious about them. As we move into the new phase, please remember that COVID is still in the territory, and the threat of the highly transmissible Delta variant looms. This phase emphasizes strong individual awareness of your behaviour and the wishes of others, and we ask that you remain respectful of the wishes of other community members. Please continue to follow the Safe Six plus One. Above all, be careful, respectful, and kind to one another.

The vaccine remains the best way out of the pandemic, so please consider getting it if you haven't already done so. As of August 14th, 74% of the population from Johnson's Crossing to Swift River received both doses of the vaccine, and 79% had received the first shot. Please reach out to the Teslin Health Centre about scheduling an appointment. As always, please be respectful of the diversity of views around the vaccine and the pandemic.

You will see some work happening around town. Our new fire hall is going up beside the Deisleen Development Corporation offices with ground preparation this summer and construction beginning as we head into the fall. The project is slated to be completed by next August. While it is a little smaller than we originally anticipated due to rising costs, it will be a significant upgrade over our current hall and free up space in our municipal building for other public works vehicles. The project is being managed by Colliers and overseen by Cole Hunking from VOT Public Works.

We are also working on trails within Teslin, specifically off the bottom part of Sawmill Road. You will see the trail emerging on the left-hand shortly after turning onto Sawmill off the highway. We are cleaning up some existing trails and building on the existing informal trail network in and around Teslin. This project is only part of the multi-year trail development plan we approved last summer, and it's going to take several years

and constant revision before the trail network is fully developed. More details on this summer's efforts and future plans are available at the Village Office.

Our crews were busy this summer dealing with flooding in conjunction with TTC and the DDC. Cole Hunking put in considerable effort head manning our combined efforts and working with Emergency Measures at YG, who provided funding for hiring a sandbagging crew and paying for bank erosion mitigation efforts. The bank erosion in Smarchville and a couple of places out of town were larger projects than anticipated, but we managed it successfully. Our sandbagging efforts not only helped us here in Teslin, but we were also able to send many pallets to help Marsh Lake flooding efforts. Furthermore, these projects also gave several contractors and people in the community work over the summer. The YG Minister of Community Services, Richard Mostyn, was recently very complimentary of our efforts in Teslin to handle the situation here and help out another community. Many thanks to Cole for his extraordinary efforts. He had a busy summer planned before the flooding and just got busier as the water rose.

You will notice that our recreation staff also had a busy summer, sometimes for all the wrong reasons. The COVID outbreak caused a lot of uncertainty, cancellations, and rescheduling. Despite these challenges, the recreation staff persevered and put on some terrific programming. The elusive softball tournament is scheduled for the end of August after some volunteers agreed to take it on after a couple of thwarted attempts by us. Thank you to the volunteers for taking that on. Although we have recreation staff, we still need volunteers to help out, and I am glad someone stepped up. It only helps us put on more events for the community. Many thanks to Lindsay for her determination and patience during this trying summer.

We recently secured Community Development Funds to research the Village of Teslin boundary expansion. This issue is a long outstanding topic of discussion between VOT and TTC, and in November, we both agreed that we want to re-engage in the process. From a municipal perspective, this is about expanding our service delivery area and giving people to opportunity to vote in municipal elections and potentially run for council. For TTC is about receiving municipal services for their citizens. It is long overdue. We have several areas that need additional research and community consultation, which will take about a year before delivering it to the Minister of Community Services and the Municipal Board for approval. Should it pass, boundary expansion will be a significant step forward for the community.

We seem to be in election hell or heaven, depending on your view on politics. We had a territorial election in spring, and we have a federal election coming up on September 20th. Regardless of your views, please get out and exercise your right to vote.

This is also an excellent opportunity to remind you of the municipal election year coming in October. I am always proud to let other communities know of our council's diversity, where we have three Tlingit women serving on the council. It is representative of our community and keeps and the rest of us sharp. I hope this continues on the next council. If you are interested in getting involved in our community at the municipal level, I encourage you to run for council. We are always looking for people who want to improve their community. Feel free to ask me questions about my experience on council. Nomination forms are available at the municipal office.

Before I go, I wanted to thank this council for their work this term. This was a challenging term as our original plan focused on recreation and revising the Official Community Plan (OCP) and Zoning Bylaw, which are consultation-intensive processes. It was going to be significant work for the council. Then, the pandemic hit, disrupting municipal operations, council meetings, the community, and the world. The many months of uncertainty and constant changes made things very challenging for everyone. However, this council accomplished a lot in three years despite the pandemic, including:

- Several public consultations of the Official Community Plan (OCP) and approval of the revised plan.
- Several public consultations of the Zoning Bylaw and approval of the revised plan.
- Emphasizing recreation, specifically outdoor recreation, finalizing the trail development plan, and starting a multi-year trail project.
- Repeal of a dated Dog Control Bylaw and replacement with a new Animal Control Bylaw based on the information from the OCP consultations.
- Approval of a new business licence bylaw to replace a very dated version.
- Refreshing the boundary expansion discussion with Teslin Tlingit Council, an issue which will hopefully be resolved in the next term.
- Securing funding for the new firehall and public works yard and starting construction of both projects.
- Doing our part to keep the community safe during an unprecedented pandemic and constantly changing situation.

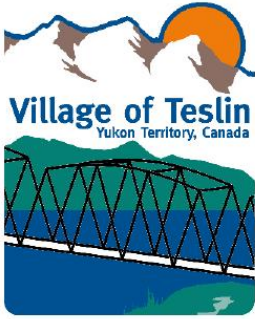

Applications are reviewed by a locally based committee and funding decisions are based on eligibility, merit and ability to meet fund criteria.



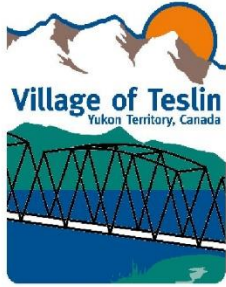
