

TESLIN ROADS

As we are coming to the end of winter, the roads will be wet and slippery. We will have the sander out as often as possible, but please drive with caution.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The landfill fees and fines are listed in the Teslin Post, available at the Village office, posted at the landfill and on our website. If you would like to review the bylaw please stop by or call the Village Office.

We will be continuing to try to improve efficiency and customer convenience at the facility throughout the summer. If you have any questions or concerns as we change or modify operation at the facility please come by the Village office.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

Please ensure recycling bins are outside and easily accessible for pickup.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful on what is being flushed down the system.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

With the changing weather please keep your driveway and pathway accessible for the water truck and driver.

Both water trucks are good working order.

DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

5 Best Spring Activities For Families


Reconnect with Nature

Make a Bird House







Teslin Landfill Notice



Hours of operation

The Teslin landfill only accepts these items on a regular basis.

Starting September 28, 2017, the Village of Teslin is implementing a new bin system at the Teslin transfer station. This system will help us meet our permit requirements by; keeping materials sorted, being able to track volumes of each waste stream, improve safety and predict upcoming costs.

Construction waste, metal, and appliance areas of the landfill will be closed to the public and the public will drop these waste streams into designated bins that are set up near the household waste bins. Arrangements can be made with the Village office for commercial vehicles to continue to have access to the designated areas.

- **Household Garbage**
- **Clean Metal** – Metal products by themselves with **NO** other products attached, rubber, wood, plastic, etc.
- **Cars**– **NO** fluids and **NO** tires otherwise a handling fee will be charged
- **Tires** - Tires on rims will be charged a sorting and handling fee of \$10.00
 - I. 19" rim and smaller tire (no charge)
 - II. 20" rim and larger tire (\$32.00)
- **Electronic Waste** – Computers, radios, TV's or any other electronic device
- **Compost** – All organic waste
- **Construction Waste** –Construction waste deemed as special waste will not be accepted
- **Burnables** – Brush, Scrap lumber, yard trimmings, etc.
- **Recycle Center** - All non–refundable recycling has to be sorted in bins at the recycling center. All refundable recyclables will be counted at the recycling center.

Any larger items or any products not listed above will have to be brought to the Village of Teslin's attention prior to being dropped off at the landfill. If you are unsure of any items call the Village of Teslin and we will tell you if we can accept them at the landfill.

Dumping fees are attached and posted at the landfill or can be found in the Teslin Post

Special Waste

**Special waste will be accepted at the Village of Teslin’s public works yard
not at the landfill.**

- **Fluorescent light tubes**
- **Batteries**
- **Aerosol Cans**
- **Oil Filters**
- **Antifreeze**
- **Old propane bottles**



Any other special waste products not listed above can be inquired about at the Village of Teslin public works office. We will tell you what we accept or how you can properly dispose of it. If you are unsure what is classified as special waste contact the Village of Teslin office at **(867) 390-2530**.

MARCH & APRIL 2018

APRIL IS CANCER MONTH

Normally, our cells are healthy, but sometimes instructions get mixed up cells produce lumps or tumors, or spread through the bloodstream to other parts of the body. Most cancers seem to be the result of a mix of risk factors that can be hereditary, the result of lifestyle choices, or due to exposure to cancer-causing substances.

The earlier cancer is found, the easier it is to treat. Get to know your own body and what is normal for you. If you have any concerns, talk to your local nurse or doctor. There are also screening tests that can detect cancer, even if you do not have symptoms.

BREAST CANCER: Mammography (a low-dose x-ray) can help find lumps or abnormalities in the breast that you may not be able to feel. If you are 40 or older, talk to your health care provider about whether breast cancer screening is right for you

CERVICAL CANCER: A Pap test is a test of cells of the cervix, the opening between the vagina and the uterus. The test looks for cells that are not normal and can cause cervical cancer. Most women ages 25 to 69 need regular Pap tests. If you are between 9 and 45 years old, you can get the HPV vaccine, which can help reduce the risk of cervical cancer. Talk to your doctor about what is right for you.

COLON CANCER: In Yukon, colon cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths after lung cancer. FIT is a simple cancer screening test that detects blood in a stool sample, which can be a sign of pre-cancer. If you are between the ages of 50 and 74, talk to your doctor about "Doing the FIT."




